



Main findings (trend)

Employment in Queensland rose by 2,300 persons (0.1%) in February 2023 to be 58,500 persons (2.1%) higher over the year. The rise in February was driven by an increase in both full-time and part-time employment (up 1,100 and 1,200 respectively).

The employment-to-population ratio was 63.6% in February 2023, down from 63.7% in January 2023 but well above its pre-COVID ratio of 62.0%. Hours worked rose 0.2% in February and was 8.4% above its level in March 2020 (**Chart 1**).


Chart 1: Employment and hours worked, Queensland



The unemployment rate was 3.7% in February, unchanged from January 2023 and still well below the pre-COVID rate of 5.6% in March 2020 (Chart 2).

Meanwhile, Queensland's participation rate was 66.1% in February, slightly lower than January (66.2%), but well above its pre-COVID rate of 65.7%.

Nationally, trend employment rose by 19,800 persons in February (0.1%, **Table 2**) to be 855,700 (6.6%) above its pre-COVID level of March 2020. In seasonally adjusted terms, employment nationally rebounded 64,600 persons in February, following a 27,500 person decline across the previous two months.

The ABS noted the increase in employment (nationally) 'follows consecutive falls in December and January. In January, this reflected a larger than usual number of people waiting to start a new job, the majority of whom returned to or commenced their jobs in February. This was particularly evident in the South-East of Australia, with larger than seasonal numbers of people entering into employment across New South Wales, Victoria and the ACT.'

The national unemployment rate was unchanged at a revised 3.5% in February (**Table 1**). Hours worked increased by 0.2% in the month to be 7.4% above its pre-COVID level in March 2020.
