

Figure 1 Annual change in employment, Queensland -Outback SA4





Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, April 2023

Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force survey data, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data.

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages.

- The number of employed persons in Queensland Outback SA4 in April 2023 was 35,600 persons, a decrease of 2,000 employed persons, or 5.4% over the year (Figure 1).
- The unemployment rate in Queensland Outback SA4 in April 2023 was 9.8 per cent, a decrease of 0.9 percentage point over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the highest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Queensland Outback SA4 in April 2023 was 61.2 per cent, a decrease of 5.2 percentage points over the year (Table 1).
