




#### Employment growth, annual

# **Main findings**

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force survey data, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data.

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages.

- The number of employed persons in Toowoomba SA4 in September 2023 was 79,700 persons, an increase of 5,600 employed persons, or 7.5% over the year (Figure 1).
- The unemployment rate in Toowoomba SA4 in September 2023 was 4.3 per cent, a decrease of 1.0 percentage point over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the seventh-highest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Toowoomba SA4 in September 2023 was 60.5 per cent, an increase of 1.9 percentage points over the year (Table 1).
