



Employment growth, annual









Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, November 2023

Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force survey data, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data.

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages.

- The number of employed persons in Sunshine Coast SA4 in November 2023 was 219,300 persons, an increase of 21,100 employed persons, or 10.6% over the year (Figure 1).
- The unemployment rate in Sunshine Coast SA4 in November 2023 was 3.1 per cent, an increase of 0.5 percentage point over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the fourth-lowest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Sunshine Coast SA4 in November 2023 was 64.3 per cent, an increase of 4.7 percentage points over the year (Table 1).
