


Figure 1 Annual change in employment, Brisbane - South SA4





Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, December 2023

Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force survey data, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data.

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages.

- The number of employed persons in Brisbane South SA4 in December 2023 was 216,100 persons, an increase of 5,200 employed persons, or 2.4% over the year (Figure 1).
- The unemployment rate in Brisbane South SA4 in December 2023 was 3.6 per cent, an increase of 0.2 percentage point over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the seventh-lowest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Brisbane South SA4 in December 2023 was 69.8 per cent, unchanged over the year (Table 1).
