Main findings

- Brisbane's headline consumer price index (CPI) increased 1.0% in June quarter 2023, resulting in a 6.3% increase over the year. In annual terms, Brisbane recorded the third-largest increase while Adelaide recorded the largest increase for all capital cities in Australia (see Table 1).
- Compared with the weighted average of eight capital cities for June quarter 2023, Brisbane recorded stronger contributions from the CPI groups of Housing, Recreation and culture, Furnishings, household equipment and services, Clothing and footwear and Insurance and financial services. These were partly offset by detractions from the Health, Communication and Transport groups (see Figure 1).
- For Brisbane, the *Housing* group made the largest contribution to inflation in June quarter 2023 (0.34 of a percentage point). Within the *Housing* group, *Water* and sewerage increased 5.8% in the quarter.
- For Brisbane, the Health group recorded the largest detraction from inflation in June quarter 2023 (0.02 of a percentage point). Within the Health group, Pharmaceutical products decreased 1.8% in the quarter.




Figure 2 CPI annual change, Australia

- Australia's CPI for market sector goods and services, which excludes more volatile items, increased 1.2% in June quarter 2023, with an annual inflation rate of 6.5% (see Figure 2).

Figure 1 Quarterly CPI contributions, by group, June quarter 2023
