Analysis

- Queensland's trend employment growth of 0.5% in November 2004 was the sixth consecutive month of growth at or above 0.5%. In comparison, national jobs growth over the same period has ranged from 0.1% to 0.3%. Queensland, along with Western Australia, had the strongest employment growth of any state in November.
- This continued strong employment growth has seen the employment to population ratio (the proportion of the Queensland civilian population in employment) reach new highs of more than 62% in recent months.
- Queensland has recorded more than double the national rate of annual jobs growth since July 2004, with growth of 5.3% in November (2.5% nationally). This growth was also the largest annual rise in employment (97,200) of any state, accounting for around 41% of national jobs growth over the year.
- Full-time employment growth (9,000 jobs) in the State in November continued to drive total jobs growth (9,600 jobs). Similarly, strong full-time employment growth of 94,700 jobs over the year drove total jobs growth (97,200) in Queensland.
- Queensland's trend unemployment rate fell to 4.8% in November, the lowest rate since the inception of the current series in 1978. Queensland has recorded an unemployment rate lower than the national rate since August 2004, with the differential increasing to 0.5% point in November.
- The unemployment rate has fallen despite the State's trend participation rate increasing to 65.6% in November, the highest rate in the current series.

Implications

Leading indicators of jobs growth, including the ANZ
Job Advertisement series and activity in the labour
intensive retail and construction sectors, suggest that
jobs growth in coming months may moderate from the
exceptional growth of recent months.

Chart 1 Monthly Employment Growth, Trend





Chart 2 Unemployment Rate, Trend
