

ABS Labour Force, September 2012

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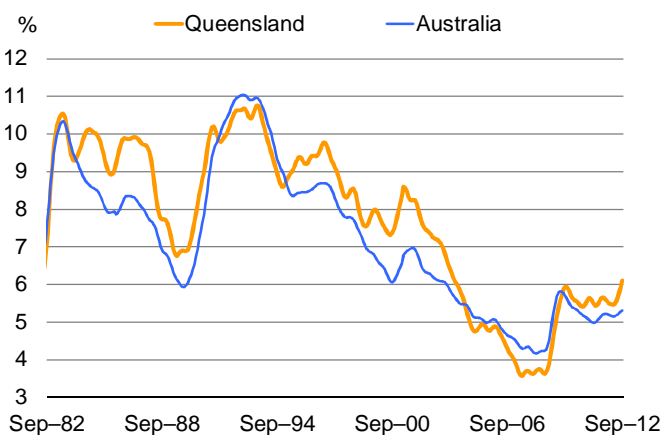
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Summary (trend)

- Revised data show that trend employment in Queensland fell for the tenth consecutive month in September 2012, down 2,200 persons (-0.1%), to be 20,200 persons (-0.9%) lower than its recent peak in November 2011.
- With the trend labour force growing 1,900 persons (0.1%) in September 2012, the trend unemployment rate in Queensland rose 0.2 percentage point to 6.1%, while the trend unemployment rate for August was also upwardly revised by 0.1 percentage point to 5.9%.
- The trend unemployment rate in September 2012 was the highest since December 2003. The recent increase in the unemployment rate has also occurred during a period where the trend participation rate, at 66.4%, has reached its lowest level since April 2006.
- Seasonally adjusted (sa) employment in Queensland fell 20,800 persons (-0.9%) in September 2012. This fall resulted in sa employment being at its lowest level since February 2011.
- With sa employment falling faster than the sa labour force, the sa unemployment rate rose 0.3 percentage point to 6.3%, while the unemployment rate for August was revised upwards 0.1 percentage point to 6.0%.
- National trend employment fell 1,000 persons (0.0%) in September, with the unemployment rate steady at 5.3% (with the August unemployment rate upwardly revised 0.1 percentage point to 5.3%).
- National sa employment rose 14,500 persons (0.1%) in September, a stronger result than market expectations of a 3,750 person rise. The sa unemployment rate rose 0.3 percentage point to 5.4%, compared with market expectations of a 0.2 percentage point rise to 5.3%.
- With the resiliently high A\$ and global economic uncertainty continuing to weigh on business sentiment and consumer confidence, any improvement in employment growth in Queensland will likely be modest over the near-term.

Chart 2: Monthly employment growth, trend

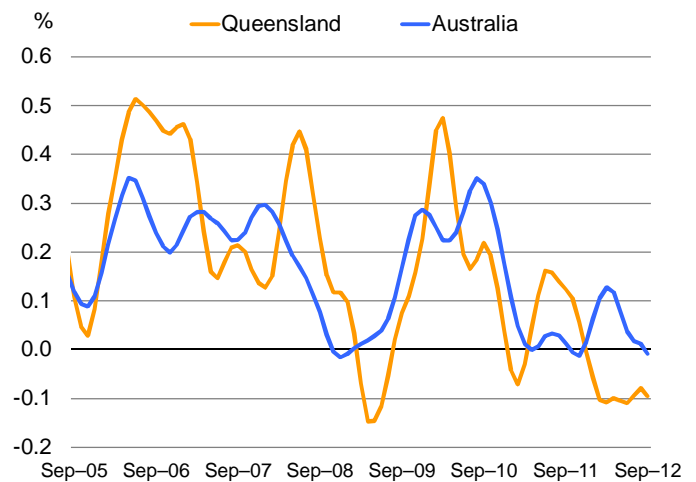
