Main findings

- Queensland's preliminary ERP at 31 March 2016 was 4,826,966 persons (20.1% of the Australian population). This reflects an increase of 61,769 persons over the 12 months, and 18,979 persons since 31 December 2015 (Figure 1).




Figure 2 Population growth rate, Australia and states and territories, year ending 31 March 2016

- Queensland recorded a population growth rate of 1.3% in the 12 months to 31 March 2016, below the national average (1.4%) and below Victoria (1.9%) and New South Wales (1.4%) (Figure 2).
- Natural increase made the largest contribution to population growth in Queensland in the 12 months to 31 March 2016 (52.2%) followed by net overseas migration (31.4%) and net interstate migration (16.4%) (Table 1).
- In the 12 months to 31 March 2016, natural increase (births minus deaths) was 32,244 persons, an increase from the 32,192 persons recorded during the 12 months to 31 December 2015.
- Net overseas migration to Queensland in the 12 months to 31 March 2016 was 19,407 persons. This was the same as the level recorded during the 12 month period to 31 December 2015 (19,407 persons).
- Net interstate migration contributed 10,118 persons to population change in Queensland over the 12 months to 31 March 2016, an increase from the 8,326 persons recorded during the 12 months to 31 December 2015.

Figure 1 Annual population increase by components of population change, Queensland
