Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages. This approach is supported by ABS advice on analysis of regional labour force estimates (see Table 16(b) of *Labour Force, Australia, Detailed* (cat. no. 6291.0.55.001)).

- Brisbane Inner City SA4 had the lowest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during May 2018 with an unemployment rate of 5.8 per cent (Figure 1).
- Queensland - Outback SA4 had the highest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during May 2018 with an unemployment rate of 49.5 per cent (Figure 1).

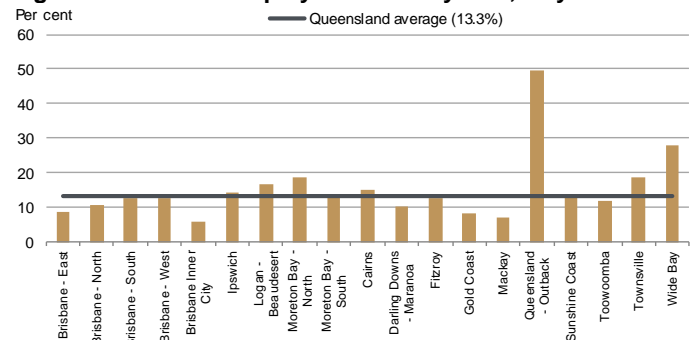
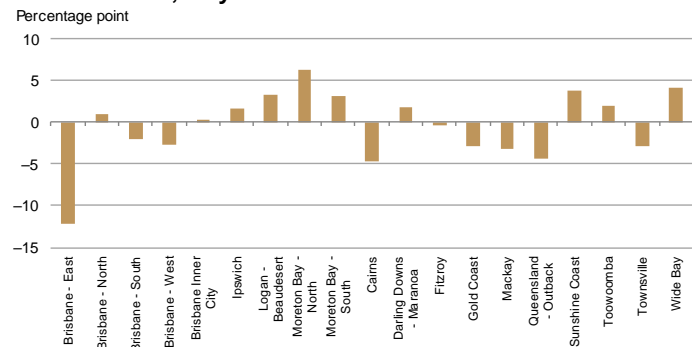


Figure 2 Annual change in youth unemployment rate by SA4, May 2018

- Brisbane - East SA4 had the largest percentage point decrease in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to May 2018 with an unemployment rate decrease of 12.2 percentage points (Figure 2).
- Moreton Bay - North SA4 had the largest percentage point increase in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to May 2018 with an unemployment rate increase of 6.3 percentage points (Figure 2).

Figure 1 Youth unemployment rate by SA4, May 2018
