Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages. This approach is supported by ABS advice on analysis of regional labour force estimates (see Table 16(b) of *Labour Force, Australia, Detailed* (cat. no. 6291.0.55.001)).

Note: Due to flooding in Townsville in February 2019, there was a very low responding sample for the Townsville SA4. As a result, the ABS imputed sample for this region in February 2019. The ABS re-assessed this imputation and have not revised the imputed data for February. Whilst QGSO publish 12-month averages to remove volatility due to small sample sizes, users should exercise caution when looking at Townsville data for February 2019.

- Mackay SA4 had the lowest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during March 2019 with an unemployment rate of 7.6 per cent (Figure 1).
- Queensland - Outback SA4 had the highest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during March 2019 with an unemployment rate of 24.3 per cent (Figure 1).

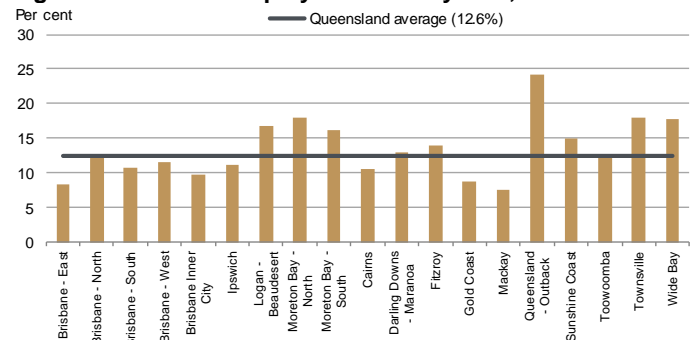
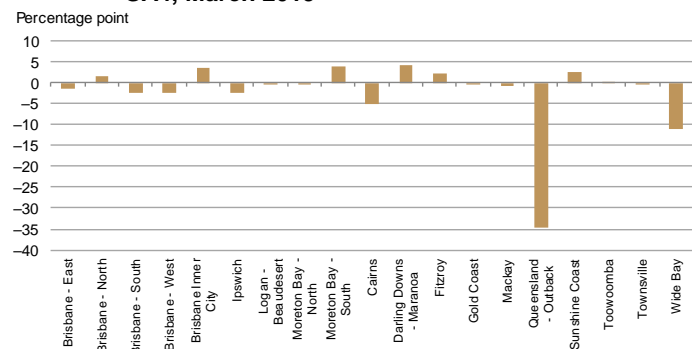


Figure 2 Annual change in youth unemployment rate by SA4, March 2019

- Queensland - Outback SA4 had the largest percentage point decrease in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to March 2019 with an unemployment rate decrease of 34.7 percentage points (Figure 2).
- Darling Downs - Maranoa SA4 had the largest percentage point increase in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to March 2019 with an unemployment rate increase of 4.1 percentage points (Figure 2).

Figure 1 Youth unemployment rate by SA4, March 2019
