## **Main findings**

Note: Commentary on monthly figures is based on nominal values throughout and, as such, movements are affected by price and quantity changes.

- The trend estimate of Queensland's retail turnover increased 0.6% in May 2012. Australia's trend turnover also increased, by 0.4% during the month (Figure 1).
- The trend value of Queensland's retail turnover increased from \$4,391.1 million in April 2012 to \$4,415.7 million in May 2012.
- The increase in Queensland's nominal retail turnover in May 2012 reflected higher spending in all industry groups. For Australia, the only industry group that showed a decrease in spending was Household goods retailing.




Figure 2: Annual change in retail turnover, May 2012

- The trend value of Queensland's retail turnover increased by 4.8% over the previous 12 months, from \$4,214.9 million in May 2011 (Figure 2).
- Queensland recorded the second-highest annual growth in retail trade of all states and territories (4.8%). Western Australia had the highest increase (9.8%).




Figure 3: Monthly retail turnover contribution to growth by industry group, May 2012

- Cafes, restaurants and takeaway food services recorded the largest contribution to retail turnover growth in Queensland in the month (0.15 percentage point). Food retailing recorded the largest contribution to retail turnover growth in Australia (0.15 percentage point) in May 2012 (Figure 3).

Figure 1: Monthly change in retail turnover
