living in **1,869,462** private dwellings

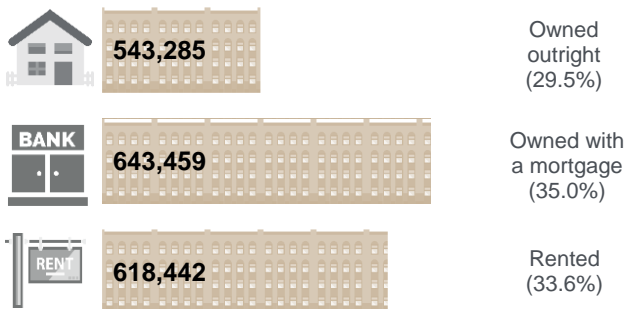
1,170,334 of us were **born overseas** and **681,877** speak a **language other than English** at home



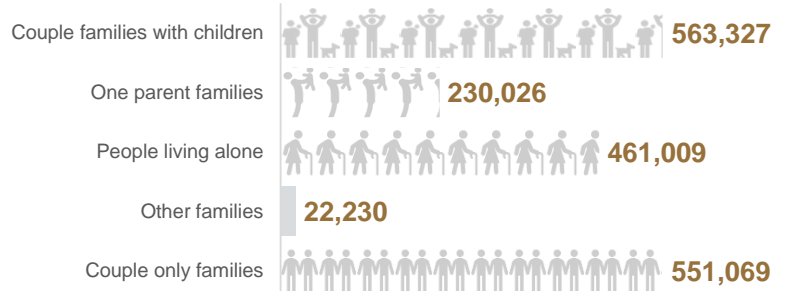
4.6% of Queenslanders identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples
