





over 8 in 10 workers were male






### 1 in 5 employed Queenslanders worked as Professionals


# Sales Workers are most likely to work part-time




Females 1 in 4 were employed as Professionals, and Community and personal service workers continued to increase

More than **1** in **4** Sales Workers were studying, with **84.9%** of those **studying full-time** 








Males while for males, **Professionals** increased and other occupation groups were relatively similar over time.
