and over **3 in 4** of these were **female**

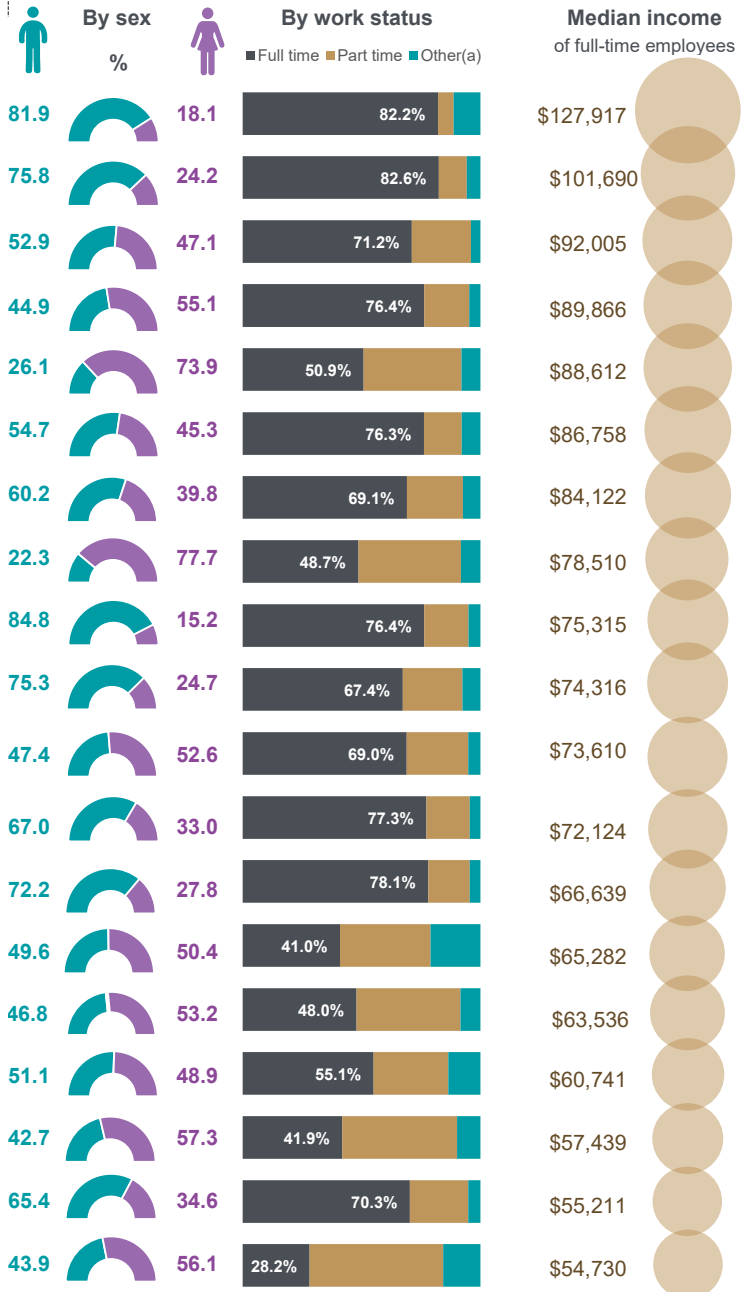
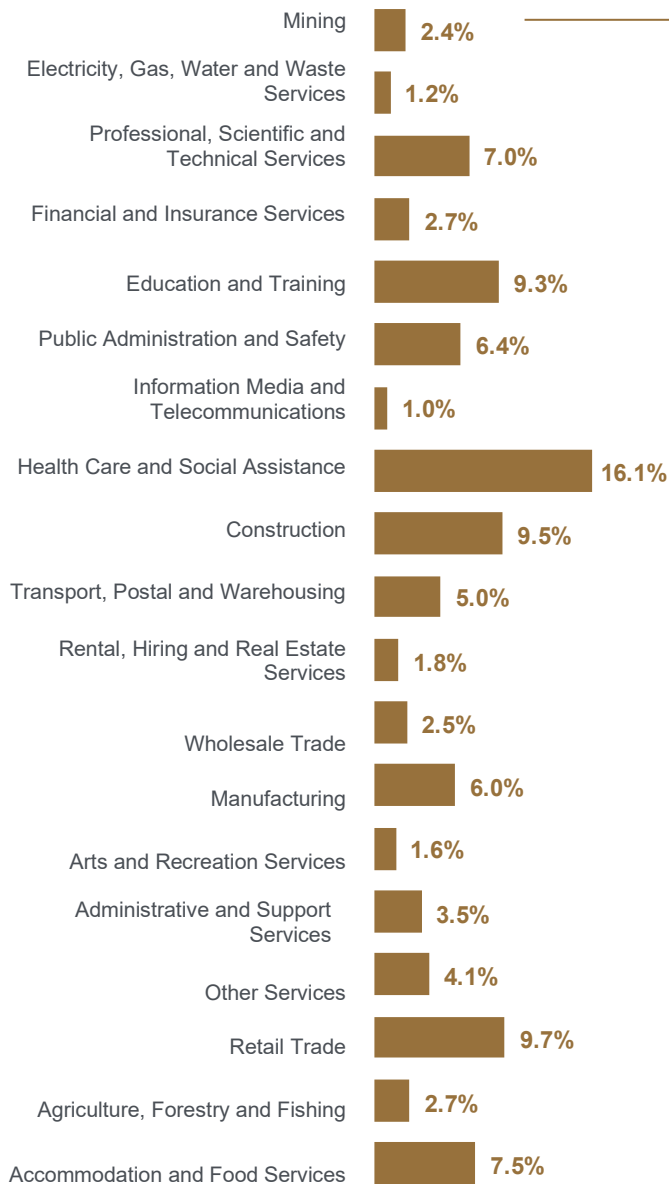
Employees in **Health Care and Social Assistance**

Queenslanders working in the **Mining** industry had:

- the **highest** median full-time income **\$127,917**
- over **80%** employed **full-time**
- over **8 in 10** workers were **male**



Queenslanders working in the **Accommodation and Food Services** industry had:

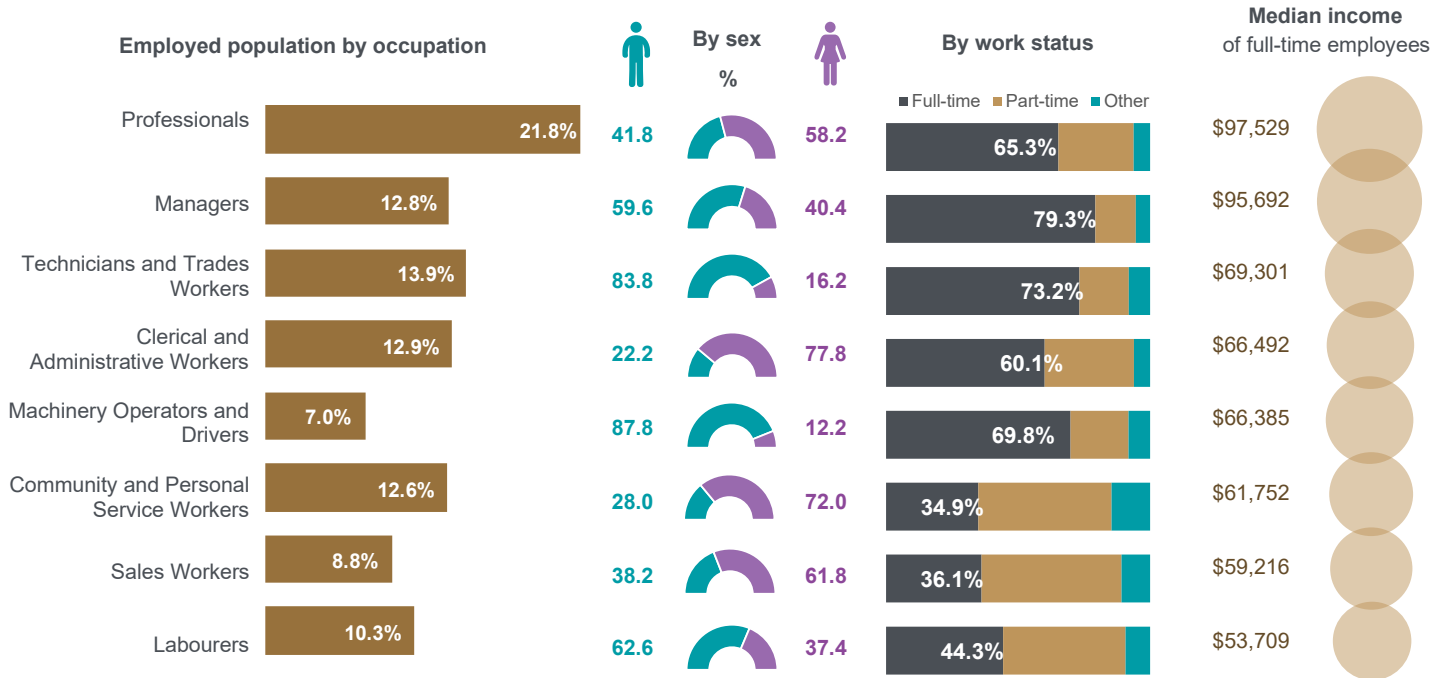
- the **lowest** median full-time income **\$54,730**
- less than **1 in 3** employed **full-time**
- over **half** of workers were **female**



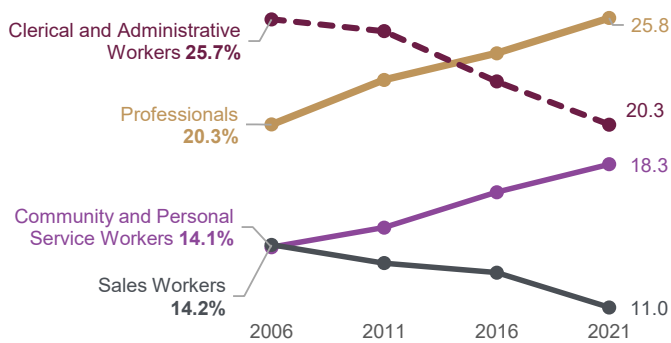

1 in 5 employed Queenslanders worked as Professionals

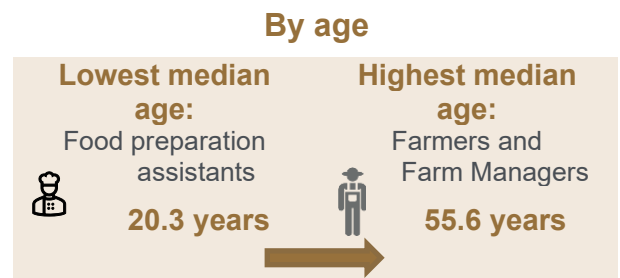
Sales Workers are most likely to work part-time



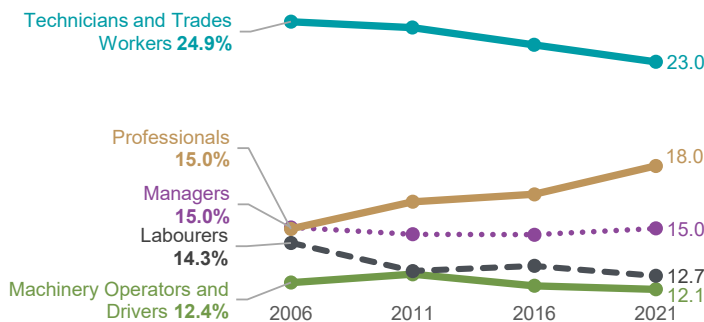
Females 1 in 4 were employed as Professionals, and Community and personal service workers continued to increase



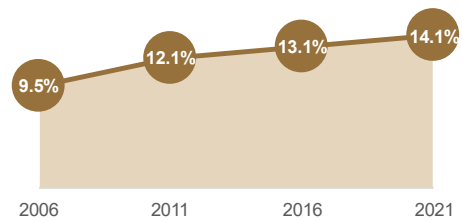
More than 1 in 4 Sales Workers were studying, with 84.9% of those studying full-time
