More than **1 in 10** were employed in the **Health Care and Social Assistance** industry

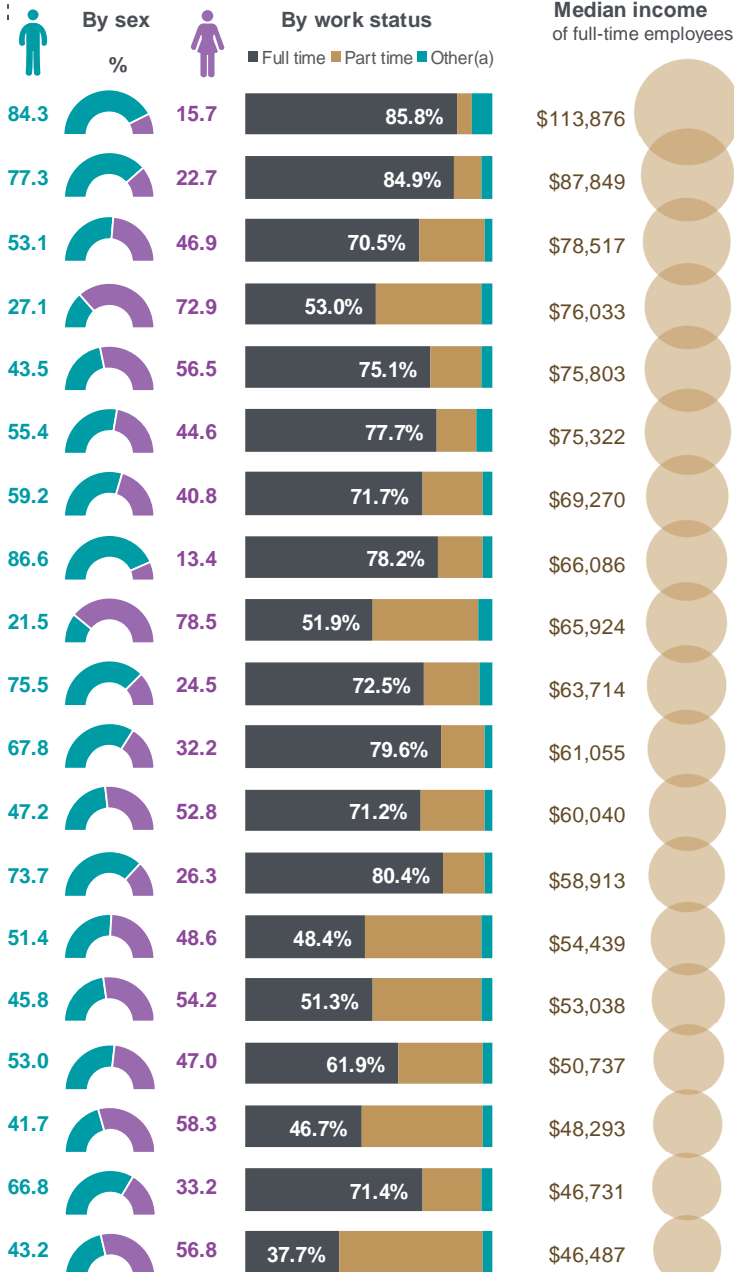
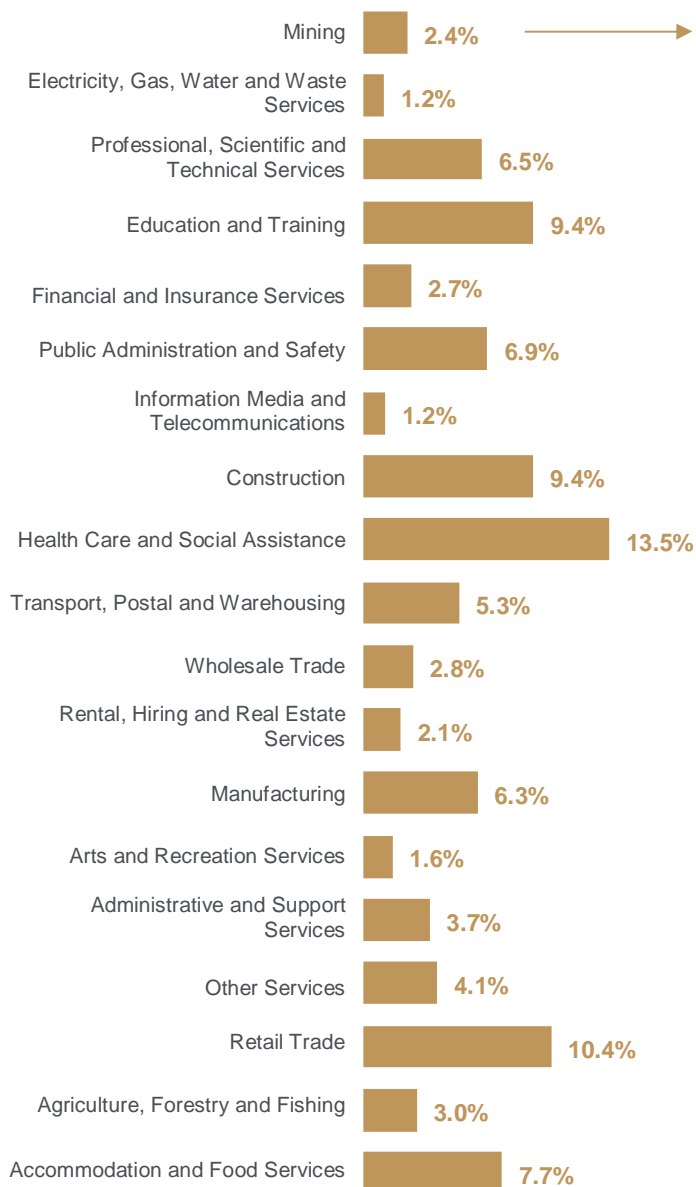


and over **3 in 4** of these were **female**

Employees in **Health Care and Social Assistance** **48.6%** since 2006

Employees in **Manufacturing** **28.5%** since 2006

Queenslanders working in the **Mining** industry had:

- the **highest** median full-time income **\$113,876**
- over 85%** employed **full-time**
- over 8 in 10** employees were **male**



Queenslanders working in the **Accommodation and Food Services** industry had:

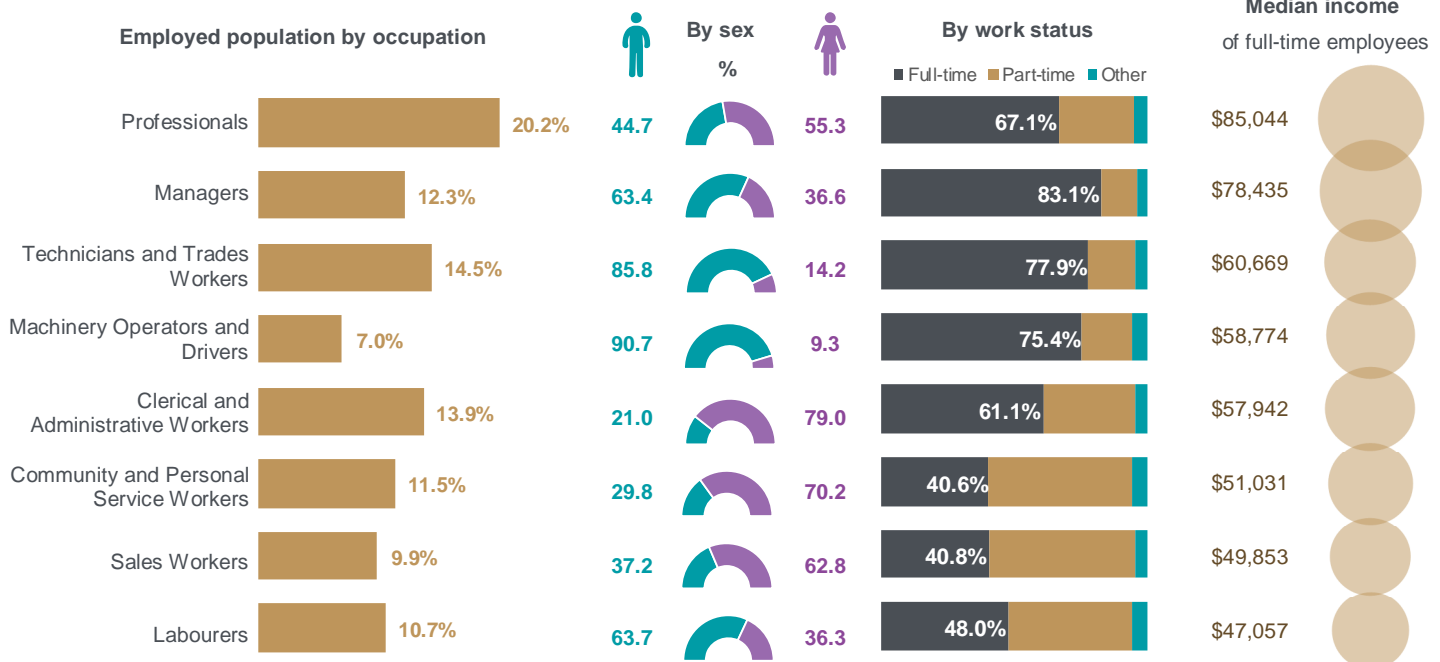
- the **lowest** median full-time income **\$46,487**
- less than 2 in 5** employed **full-time**
- over half** of employees were **female**

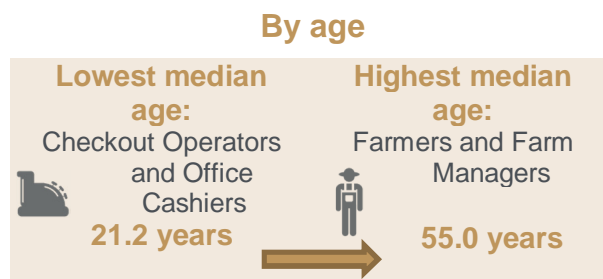

In 2016 more females were employed as Professionals than Clerical and Administrative Workers for the first time...

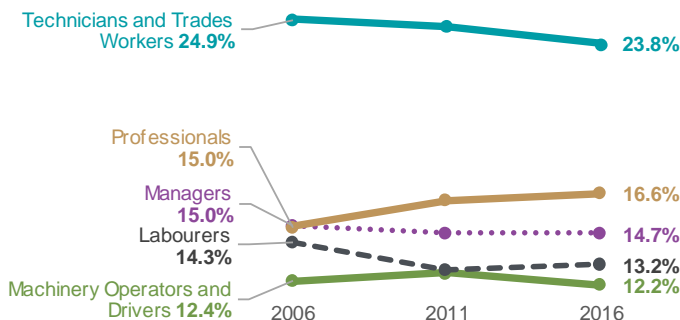


More than 1 in 5 Sales Workers were studying, with 85.1% of those studying full-time

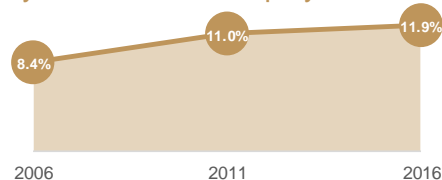
