Main findings

Note: Data in this brief are based on 4–quarter moving averages and are derived by the QGSO.

- In the February reference month of March quarter 2025, there were 2,962,751 employed persons in Queensland, which accounted for 20.5% of Australia's total employment.
- Over the year to March quarter 2025, of Queensland's top ten industries by number employed, the largest percentage increase in employment occurred in the Accommodation and food services industry (11.4%).
 For Australia, within these ten industries, the Education and training industry had the largest percentage increase (5.2%).
- Over the year to March quarter 2025, of Queensland's top ten industries by number employed, the Retail trade industry recorded the largest contribution to employment changes in Queensland (0.9 of a percentage point). In comparison, the Professional, scientific and technical services industry recorded the largest detraction in Queensland (0.6 of a percentage point) (Figure 1).





Figure 2 Percentage of employed persons by industry of employment, March quarter 2025

- During March quarter 2025, the highest percentage of total employment in Queensland was recorded in the Health care and social assistance industry (15.9%). The highest percentage of total employment in Australia was also in Health care and social assistance (15.7%) (Figure 2).

Figure 1 Contribution to employment changes by industry, year to March quarter 2025
