

Main findings



- In the August reference month of September guarter 2025, there were 2,993,134 employed persons in Queensland, which accounted for 20.5% of Australia's total employment.
- Over the year to September quarter 2025, the largest percentage increase in employment in Queensland occurred in the occupation group 'Technicians and trades workers' (7.8%), followed by 'Professionals' (6.5%). In Australia, the largest percentage increase occurred in 'Professionals' (4.0%).
- Over the year to September quarter 2025, the occupation group 'Professionals' recorded the largest contribution to employment changes in Queensland (1.5 percentage points), followed by 'Technicians and trades workers' (1.1 percentage points). In comparison, the occupation group 'Managers' recorded the largest detraction in Queensland (0.5 of a percentage point) (Figure 1).
- During September quarter 2025, the occupation group 'Professionals' had the largest percentage of total employment in Queensland (24.3%), followed by 'Technicians and trades workers' (14.9%). The largest percentage in total employment in Australia was also in 'Professionals' (27.0%) (Figure 2).
