



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Main findings (trend)

Employment in Queensland rose by 6,000 persons (0.2%) in August 2023 to be 59,300 persons (2.1%) higher over the year. The rise in August was driven by an increase in both full-time and part-time employment (up 5,100 and 1,000 respectively).


The employment-to-population ratio was 63.7% in August 2023, stable over the month and above the pre-COVID ratio of 62.0%. Hours worked remained unchanged in August at 395.7 million hours, to be 3.1% higher over the year (**Chart 1**).





Meanwhile, Queensland's participation rate was 66.5% in August 2023 unchanged from July 2023, and above its pre-COVID rate of 65.7%.

<u>Nationally</u>, trend employment rose by 28,300 persons in August (0.2%, **Table 2**) to be 1,118,000 (8.6%) above its pre-COVID level in March 2020. In seasonally adjusted terms, employment nationally grew by 64,900 persons which greatly exceeded market expectations for 23,000 persons.

The ABS noted, 'The strength in hours worked over the past year, relative to employment growth, shows the demand for labour is continuing to be met by people working more hours, to some extent".

The national unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.7% in August (**Table 1**). Hours worked increased by 0.2% in the month to be 10.8% above its pre-COVID level in March 2020.
