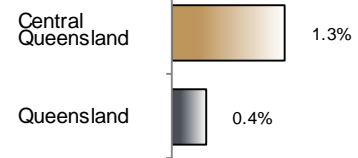

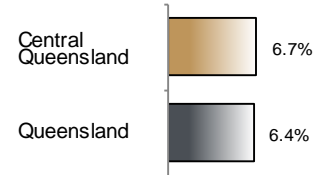

Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force survey data, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data. This volatility means it can be difficult to detect real world phenomena, such as those caused by the social distancing measures introduced to combat COVID-19, in the data. **As a result, it is not recommended regional labour force data be used to assess the impact of COVID-19.**

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages.

- The number of employed persons in Central Queensland SA4 in June 2020 was 116,700 persons, an increase of 1,500 employed persons, or 1.3% over the year (Figure 1).

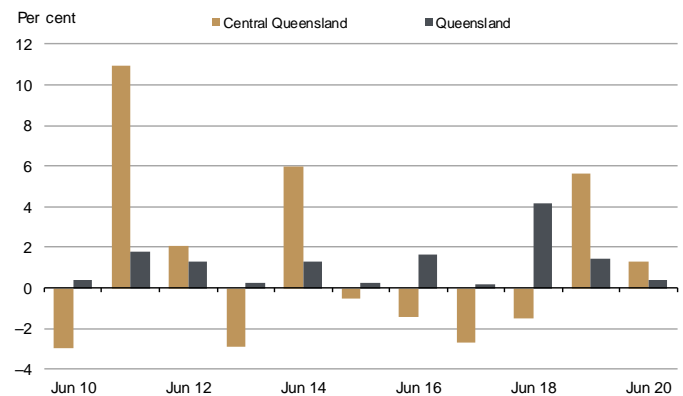


Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, June 2020

- The unemployment rate in Central Queensland SA4 in June 2020 was 6.7 per cent, an increase of 1.1 percentage points over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the ninth-highest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Central Queensland SA4 in June 2020 was 70.8 per cent, an increase of 1.7 percentage points over the year (Table 1).

Figure 1 Annual change in employment, Central Queensland SA4
