Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force survey data, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data. This volatility means it can be difficult to detect real world phenomena, such as those caused by the social distancing measures introduced to combat COVID-19, in the data. **As a result, it is not recommended regional labour force data be used to assess the impact of COVID-19.**

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages.

- Mackay - Isaac - Whitsunday SA4 had the largest annual growth in employment of all 19 SA4s during September 2020 with a growth of 8,200 employed persons (Figure 1).

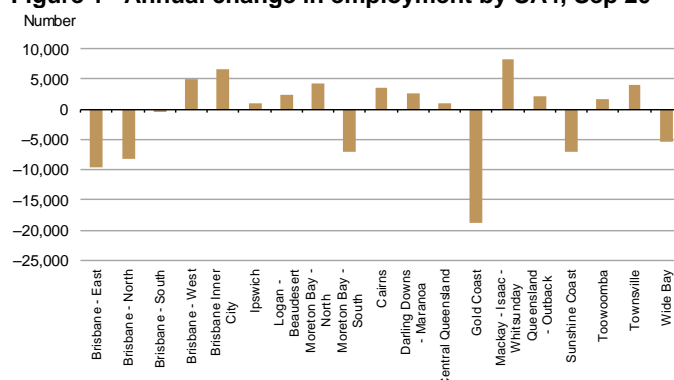
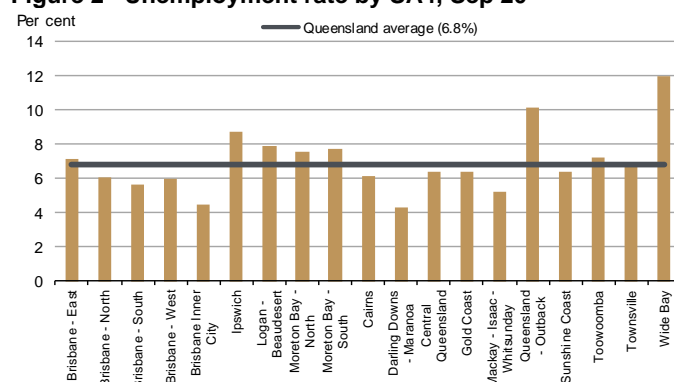


Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, Sep 20

- Darling Downs - Maranoa SA4 had the lowest unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during September 2020 with an unemployment rate of 4.3 per cent (Figure 2).
- Queensland - Outback SA4 had the largest percentage point decrease in unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to September 2020 with an unemployment rate decrease of 3.0 percentage points (Table 1).
- Brisbane Inner City SA4 had the highest participation rate of all 19 SA4s during September 2020 with 75.5% and Wide Bay had the lowest participation rate with 49.2%.

Figure 1 Annual change in employment by SA4, Sep 20
