


Figure 1 Annual change in employment, Gold Coast SA4





Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, March 2025

Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force survey data, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data.

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages.

The ABS has imputed sample responses in Moreton Bay - North and Townsville SA4 regions for March 2025 and Townsville SA4 for February 2025 due to recent natural disasters. The ABS recommends caution when using data from these impacted regions for analysis.

- The number of employed persons in Gold Coast SA4 in March 2025 was 380,600 persons, an increase of 13,600 employed persons, or 3.7% over the year (Figure 1).
- The unemployment rate in Gold Coast SA4 in March 2025 was 3.4 per cent, a decrease of 0.3 percentage point over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the sixth-lowest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Gold Coast SA4 in March 2025 was 67.1 per cent, an increase of 0.4 percentage point over the year (Table 1).
