
Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of modelled estimates due to seasonal variation and noise associated with regional labour force modelled estimates. The modelled regional labour force estimates enhance the direct survey estimates of regional labour market data using administrative data and statistical modelling.

- The number of employed persons in Brisbane - North SA4 in January 2026 was 141,100 persons, an increase of 2,400 employed persons, or 1.7% over the year (Table 1).





Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, January 2026

- The unemployment rate in Brisbane - North SA4 in January 2026 was 3.4%, lower than the Queensland average of 4.1% (Figure 1). The unemployment rate for this area was the seventh-lowest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Brisbane - North SA4 in January 2026 was 72.4%, a decrease of 0.1 of a percentage point over the year (Table 1).

Figure 1 Unemployment rate, Brisbane - North SA4 and Queensland
