Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of modelled estimates due to seasonal variation and noise associated with regional labour force modelled estimates. The modelled regional labour force estimates enhance the direct survey estimates of regional labour market data using administrative data and statistical modelling.

- Gold Coast SA4 had the largest annual growth in employment of all 19 SA4s during January 2026 with a growth of 7,200 employed persons (Figure 1).

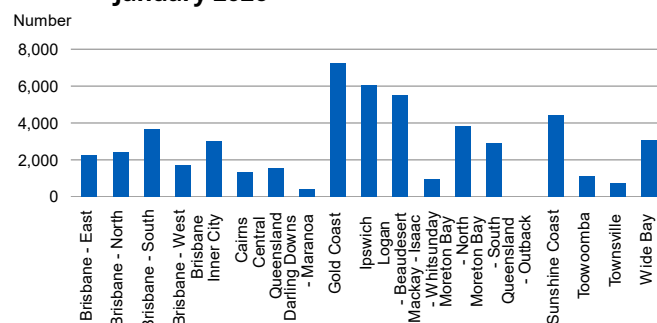
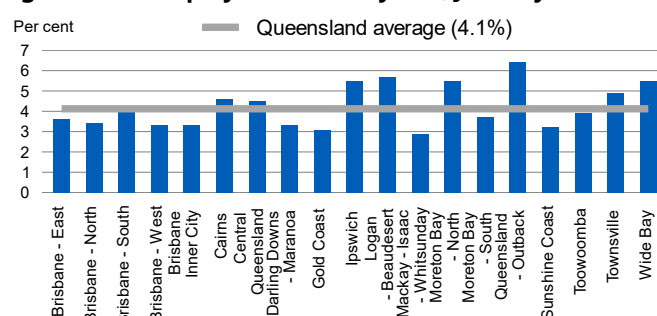


Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, January 2026

- Mackay - Isaac - Whitsunday SA4 had the lowest unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during January 2026 with an unemployment rate of 2.9% (Figure 2).
- Ipswich SA4 had the largest percentage point decrease in unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to January 2026 with an unemployment rate decrease of 0.0 percentage points (Table 1).
- Brisbane Inner City SA4 had the highest participation rate of all 19 SA4s during January 2026 with 76.8% and Wide Bay had the lowest participation rate with 53.4%.

Figure 1 Annual change in employment by SA4, January 2026
