Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of modelled estimates due to seasonal variation and noise associated with regional labour force modelled estimates. The modelled regional labour force estimates enhance the direct survey estimates of regional labour market data using administrative data and statistical modelling.

- The number of employed persons in Brisbane - South SA4 in February 2026 was 231,500 persons, an increase of 3,800 employed persons, or 1.6% over the year (Table 1).





Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, February 2026



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

- The unemployment rate in Brisbane - South SA4 in February 2026 was 4.1%, lower than the Queensland average of 4.2% (Figure 1). The unemployment rate for this area was the ninth-highest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Brisbane - South SA4 in February 2026 was 70.1%, a decrease of 0.4 of a percentage point over the year (Table 1).

Figure 1 Unemployment rate, Brisbane - South SA4 and Queensland
