Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of modelled estimates due to seasonal variation and noise associated with regional labour force modelled estimates. The modelled regional labour force estimates enhance the direct survey estimates of regional labour market data using administrative data and statistical modelling.

- The number of employed persons in Sunshine Coast SA4 in April 2026 was 225,300 persons, an increase of 4,400 employed persons, or 2.0% over the year (Table 1).

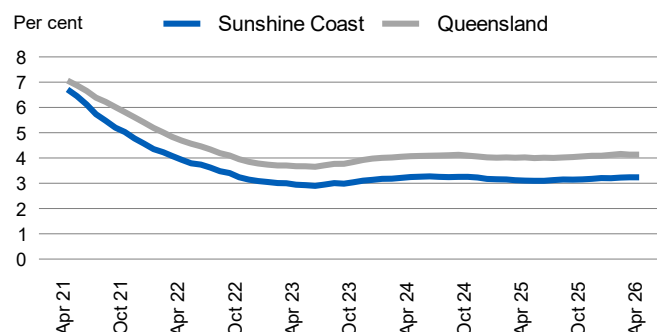
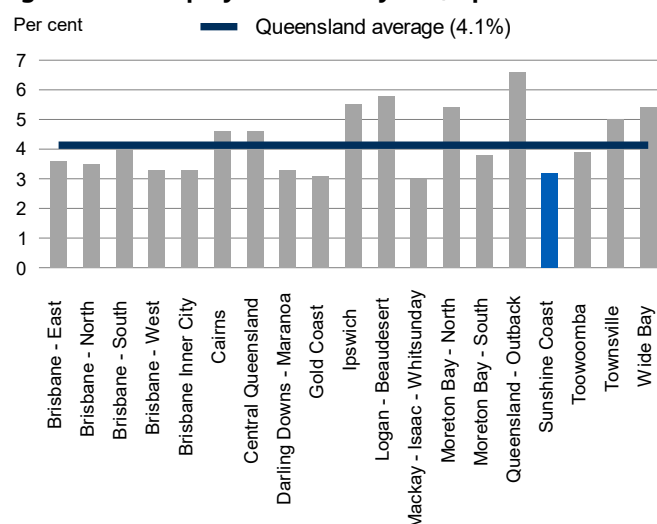


Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, April 2026

- The unemployment rate in Sunshine Coast SA4 in April 2026 was 3.2%, lower than the Queensland average of 4.1% (Figure 1). The unemployment rate for this area was the third-lowest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Sunshine Coast SA4 in April 2026 was 62.6%, unchanged over the year (Table 1).

Figure 1 Unemployment rate, Sunshine Coast SA4 and Queensland
