Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of modelled estimates due to seasonal variation and noise associated with regional labour force modelled estimates. The modelled regional labour force estimates enhance the direct survey estimates of regional labour market data using administrative data and statistical modelling.

- The number of employed persons in Wide Bay SA4 in June 2026 was 145,400 persons, an increase of 2,500 employed persons, or 1.7% over the year (Table 1).

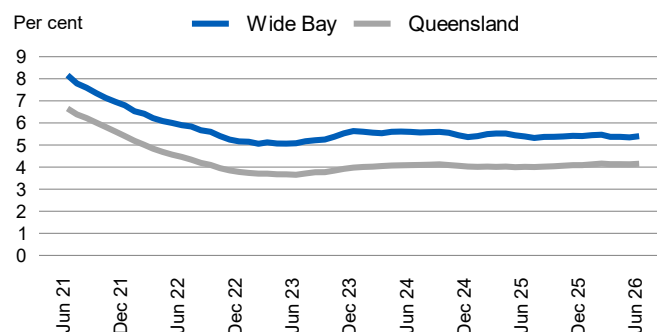
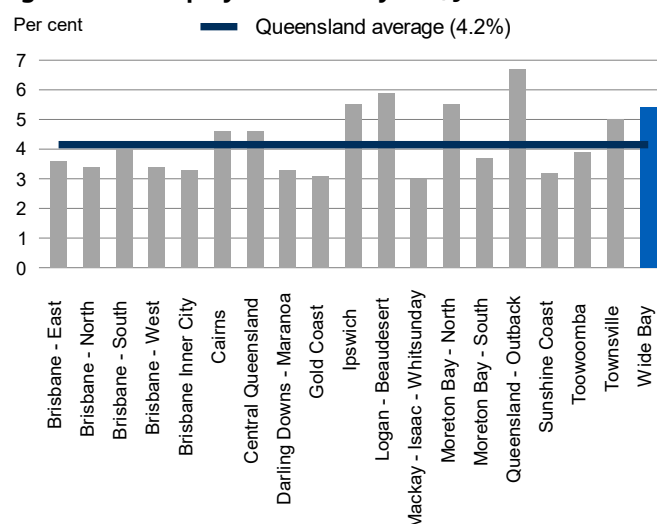


Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, June 2026



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

- The unemployment rate in Wide Bay SA4 in June 2026 was 5.4%, higher than the Queensland average of 4.2% (Figure 1). The unemployment rate for this area was the fifth-highest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Wide Bay SA4 in June 2026 was 53.6%, unchanged over the year (Table 1).

Figure 1 Unemployment rate, Wide Bay SA4 and Queensland
