Main findings

Note: All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages. This approach is supported by ABS advice on analysis of regional labour force estimates (see Table 16(b) of *Labour Force, Australia, Detailed* (cat. no. 6291.0.55.001)).

- Brisbane - East SA4 had the lowest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during March 2020 with an unemployment rate of 8.4 per cent (Figure 1).
- Wide Bay SA4 had the highest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during March 2020 with an unemployment rate of 22.2 per cent (Figure 1).

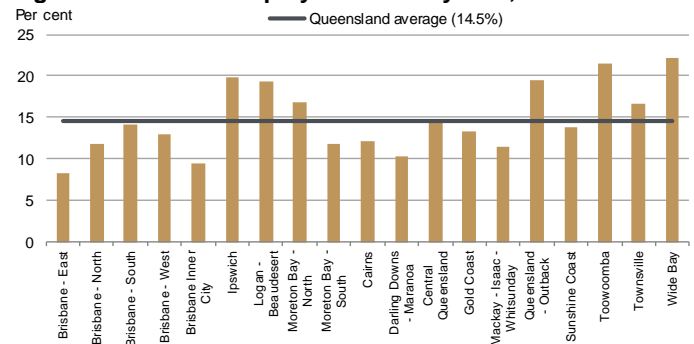
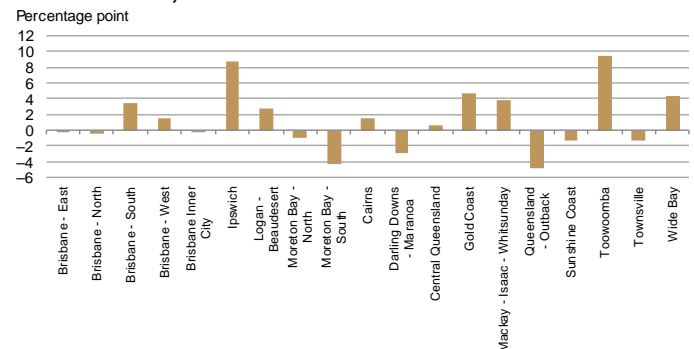


Figure 2 Annual change in youth unemployment rate by SA4, March 2020

- Queensland - Outback SA4 had the largest percentage point decrease in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to March 2020 with an unemployment rate decrease of 4.8 percentage points (Figure 2).
- Toowoomba SA4 had the largest percentage point increase in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to March 2020 with an unemployment rate increase of 9.4 percentage points (Figure 2).

Figure 1 Youth unemployment rate by SA4, March 2020
