Main findings

Note: Unless otherwise specified, all data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of modelled estimates due to seasonal variation and noise associated with regional labour force modelled estimates. The modelled regional labour force estimates enhance the direct survey estimates of regional labour market data using administrative data and statistical modelling.

- Mackay - Isaac - Whitsunday SA4 had the lowest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during April 2026 with an unemployment rate of 6.2% (Figure 1).
- Queensland - Outback SA4 had the highest youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s during April 2026 with an unemployment rate of 18.1% (Figure 1).

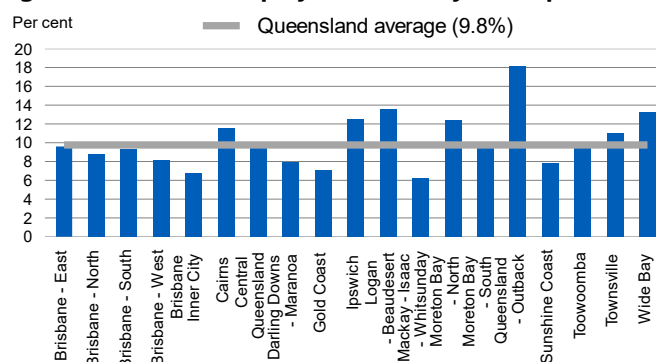
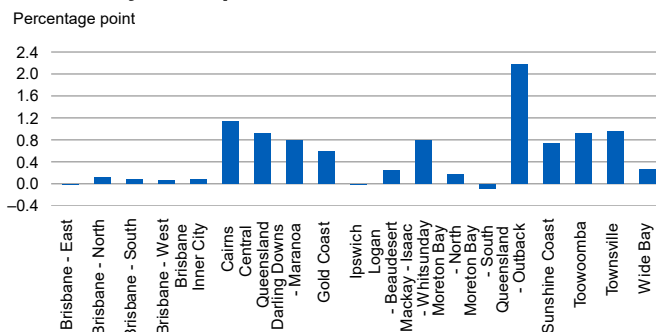


Figure 2 Annual change in youth unemployment rate by SA4, April 2026

- Moreton Bay - South SA4 had the largest percentage point decrease in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to April 2026 with an unemployment rate decrease of 0.1 of a percentage point (Figure 2).
- Queensland - Outback SA4 had the largest percentage point increase in the youth unemployment rate of all 19 SA4s over the year to April 2026 with an unemployment rate increase of 2.2 percentage points (Figure 2).

Figure 1 Youth unemployment rate by SA4, April 2026
