Main findings

Dwelling approvals

- The trend estimate for total dwelling units approved in Queensland in October 2024 was 3,220, 0.6% higher than the September 2024 figure. The national trend estimate for total dwelling approvals increased 1.7% during the month.
- The trend estimate for the number of private sector house approvals in Queensland decreased 0.3% in October 2024, with a total of 2,082 houses approved. Australia's trend estimate for the number of private sector house approvals was 9,423, an increase of 0.3% from the September 2024 figure.
- In October 2024, trend total dwelling units approved in Queensland accounted for 21.4% of Australia's total dwelling unit approvals. Private sector house approvals in Queensland accounted for 22.1% of Australia's private sector house approvals.
- The trend nominal value of residential building work approved in Queensland decreased 0.4% in October 2024 to a total of \$1,869.4 million. Australia's trend value of residential building work approved increased 0.7% during the month to \$8,275.2 million.
- In annual terms, the trend estimate for total dwelling units approved in Queensland in October 2024 was 12.9% higher than the October 2023 estimate. In comparison, total dwelling units approved in Australia increased 8.4% over the same period.


Non-residential building approvals

 The trend value of non-residential buildings approved in Queensland in October 2024 was \$909.2 million, an increase of 4.4% over the month. The value of nonresidential buildings approved in Australia in October 2024 was \$5,178.5 million, a decrease of 0.1% over the month.
