

# Exports of Queensland goods overseas, November 2025

## Key data

Exports value and change, year ending:

Queensland.....\$101.3B ↓ \$10.5B (–9.4%)

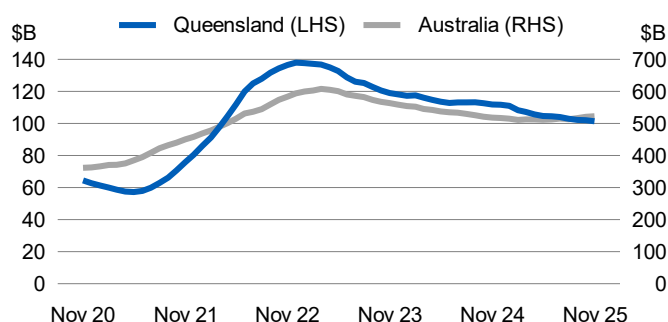
Australia .....\$522.5B ↑ \$4.3B (0.8%)

## Main findings

Data are based on nominal values in Australian dollars. Movements are affected by price and quantity changes. Data are based on exports of goods overseas by state of origin. The latest six months of data are preliminary.

- The value of Queensland exports decreased \$10.5 billion to be \$101.3 billion over the year to November 2025 (Figure 1). Australia's export value increased \$4.3 billion over this period.
- The largest increase in the value of non-confidentialised Queensland commodity exports for the year ending November 2025 was recorded in Food and live animals (increasing \$3.0 billion) (Table 1).
- The largest decrease in the value of non-confidentialised Queensland commodity exports for the year ending November 2025 was recorded in Coal, coke and briquettes (decreasing \$14.4 billion).
- The Mineral fuels and lubricants commodity group recorded the largest non-confidentialised export value from Queensland for the year to November 2025 with \$41.2 billion.
- China was Queensland's largest export destination over the year to November 2025 with \$23.9 billion (Table 2). This was a decrease of \$2.4 billion compared to the previous year. Korea, Rep of (South) was Queensland's second largest export destination with \$13.9 billion (a decrease of \$0.9 billion over the period).
