Main findings

Note: Commentary on monthly figures is based on nominal values throughout and, as such, movements are affected by price and quantity changes

Due to the impacts of COVID-19 the ABS has suspended the trend series from February 2020. All results are therefore presented in seasonally adjusted terms.

- The seasonally adjusted estimate of Queensland's . retail turnover increased 0.1% in May 2025. Australia's seasonally adjusted retail turnover increased 0.2% in May 2025.
- The seasonally adjusted value of Queensland's nominal retail turnover increased from \$7,714.2 million in April 2025 to \$7,722.1 million in May 2025.
- The increase in Queensland's nominal retail turnover in May 2025 reflected higher spending in 'Food retailing' and 'Clothing, footwear and personal accessory retailing'.




Figure 2 Annual change in retail turnover, May 2025

- The seasonally adjusted value of Queensland's retail turnover increased 4.1% over the previous 12 months, from \$7,415.8 million in May 2024 (Figure 2).
- Queensland recorded the second-largest annual growth in retail turnover of all states and territories (4.1%). Western Australia recorded the largest increase (5.6%).





Figure 3 Monthly retail turnover contribution to growth by industry group, May 2025

- 'Food retailing' recorded the largest contribution to retail turnover growth in Queensland in the month (0.15 of a percentage point). 'Clothing, footwear and personal accessory retailing' recorded the largest contribution to retail turnover growth in Australia (0.24 of a percentage point) in May 2025 (Figure 3).

Figure 1 Monthly change in retail turnover
