

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1.0 Introduction

The *Crime report, Queensland, 2020–21* provides an overview of the volume and nature of crime in Queensland, as reported (by victims, witnesses or other persons) to, or detected by, the Queensland Police Service (QPS) (reported offences). The report is a companion to the *Justice report, Queensland, 2020–21* (also produced by Queensland Government Statistician's Office), which provides an overview of the volume of criminal justice matters in Queensland, and includes statistics relating to criminal courts, youth justice, and adult corrective services.

For the purposes of this report, the reference period is the 2020–21 financial year and time series for up to 10 years to that date.

This 2020–21 edition is the fourth annual report by Queensland Government Statistician's Office (QGSO) on reported crime in the state and includes revisions to data published for earlier years where appropriate. Detailed statistics relating to reported victims of offences against the person and alleged offenders in all offence categories are featured in this report, as well as statistics for reported and cleared offences.

Tables containing person–based variables and demographic information have been subjected to confidentialisation, to ensure the anonymity of individuals is protected where numbers are small (1–3) and there is a reasonable likelihood that a person may be identified from the data published.

Statistics in this report are presented as both counts and rates. Using counts to gauge the level of crime is problematic, as areas with larger populations will presumably have higher numbers of offences than areas with smaller populations. Calculation of rates per 100,000 estimated resident population allows direct comparisons of recorded crime to be made across different geographical areas and across time, since the size of the population is taken into account in the calculation.

Data which form the basis of this report are derived from official crime reports recorded in Queensland Police Records and Information Management Exchange (QPRIME). Only offences with a status of solved, withdrawn, lapsed or unsolved are counted in this report. Cancelled and unfounded (not substantiated) crime reports have been excluded.

This report presents crime for the state and the 19 statistical areas level 4 (SA4), as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) in the *Australian Statistical Geography Standard*. Also presented in the Appendix are crime statistics by police administrative regions.

The information presented in this report may vary from data published elsewhere by QGSO and others, due to differences in the dates administrative data were extracted and frequency of revision, or in counting rules or statistical standards applied. Readers are therefore urged to exercise caution when making comparison between publications.

The report should also be read in conjunction with the Explanatory notes and glossary, where counting methodologies and other supporting information are provided to aid in the interpretation of statistics presented.

1.1. COVID-19 pandemic

Since 11 March 2020, when a pandemic was declared in response to the global spread of COVID-19, and Commonwealth and state and territory governments implemented border closures, travel restrictions, mandatory quarantine, business closures and social-distancing measures in efforts to contain the spread of the virus.

The national border remained, in effect, closed for the entire reporting period, while Queensland state border was variously opened and closed to other states and territories, depending on COVID activity at the time. For the year to 30 June 2021, Queensland experienced the country's highest population growth rate of 0.9%, including a net gain of 30,939 persons through interstate migration, and 29,352 through natural increase.¹

While maintaining business as usual policing activities, police in Queensland have been deployed since the pandemic was declared to ensure compliance with public health directives, including border control and mandatory quarantine.

In addition to the social effects of the restrictions imposed, containment measures have also had varying effects on businesses, jobs and income over the period since the pandemic was declared. To help keep Australians in jobs and support businesses affected by the significant economic impact of the pandemic, the Australian Government implemented JobKeeper from March to September 2020. The program was extended a further six months for those businesses that continued to be significantly affected by the economic downturn, but ceased at the end of March 2021.

Containment measures within the criminal justice system from March to June 2020 included police suspending roadside drink and drug driving tests. The imposed restrictions and containment measures had an immediate and noticeable


impact on levels of criminal activity in the last quarter of 2019–20, resulting in lower than expected numbers and rates of reported offences at that time. However, the annual reported crime rate was slightly higher than for the financial year preceding COVID-19 due to the higher rates in the months prior to the pandemic being declared.


The COVID-19 pandemic remains a significant and ongoing event, both globally and nationally, which has impacted crime and justice activity and outcomes. Therefore, comparisons with figures in periods before the pandemic was declared must be made with caution.


While this report presents annual statistics generally, it also provides some insights into measures in the months prior to the declaration of the pandemic and the extent to which the containment measures may have impacted the annual counts and rates for the 2020–21 reference period.


As can be seen in Figure 1, during the first half of 2019–20, the monthly total reported crime rate for Queensland steadily increased until January 2020, when it reached a peak of 981.8 offences per 100,000 persons. An immediate, non–seasonal decrease occurred in March 2020 when the pandemic was declared. When the highest level of restrictions was in place in April 2020, the rate fell to a low of 728.7 per 100,000 persons (25.8% lower than the peak in January 2020). In the following months and all through 2020–21, the monthly reported crime rate has remained at a subdued level, mostly below 800 offences per 100,000 persons. Compared with the same period in 2018–19, the year before COVID-19, the rate of reported offences in 2020–21 was around 6% to 17% lower each month.


Within the three offence categories, the drop in the rate of *offences against property* (Figure 2) largely accounted for the lower overall crime rate in 2020–21. (Please note the different scales used for each of these figures.) The monthly rates of property offences in 2020–21 were around 13% to 24% lower each month than in the same period in 2018–19. To a lesser extent, *other offences* also impacted the lower overall crime rate from September 2020 onwards (Figure 3). While the monthly rates of *offences against the person* were 6% to 40% higher than in the same period in 2018–19, they were less influential overall due to their relatively lower counts (Figure 4). (Note that ▲ in the figures below denotes when the COVID-19 pandemic was declared.)




Figure 5 Annual rates of reported offences by category, Queensland

In annual terms, the overall crime rate in 2020–21 (9,251.8 offences per 100,000 persons) was 11.2% lower than in 2018–19 (10,421.0) and 12.2% lower than in 2019–20 (10,532.8). In 2019–20, the year ended with the annual crime rate higher than in 2018–19, which was due to the higher rates in the first eight months of the year more than offsetting the reduced rates in the last three months (Figure 1). By offence category, compared with the annual rates in 2018–19, the rate of *offences against the person* in 2020–21 was 17.6% higher, whereas for *offences against property* it was 18.9% lower and for *other offences* 7.3% lower (Figure 5).

Terms used frequently in this report (see Glossary for more.)

Offence: Any act or omission by a person(s) for which a penalty could be imposed by the Australian legal system. Presented in this report in three categories:

Offences against the person: include homicide offences, assault, sexual offences, robbery and other offences against the person. **Offences against property**: include unlawful entry, arson, other property damage, unlawful use of a motor vehicle, other theft, fraud, handling stolen goods.

Other offences: include drug offences, prostitution offences, liquor & gaming offences, breach DV order, trespassing and vagrancy, Weapons Act offences, good order offences, stock-related offences, traffic and related offences, miscellaneous.

Offender: in this report, a person aged 10 years or over who, through the clearance of an offence, is alleged to be responsible for committing that offence. A person may be recorded as an offender multiple times, if they were proceeded against by police for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period. Unless otherwise specified, offender data presented in this report do not represent a count of individual (unique) offenders.

Child offender: for the purpose of this report, is an alleged offender aged 10 to 17 years at the date police action commenced against them.

Unique offender: provides an estimate of the actual number of offenders and therefore is lower than the total number of offenders. Each person is counted once only in the reference period, regardless of how many times they have been proceeded against by police in the period.


Victim: Victim statistics in this report relate only to victims of offences against the person, reported to or detected by police within the reporting period. For most offences against the person, the victim is an individual person. Statistics on non-person victims have not been included in this report.

These data show one victim for each counted offence. However, a person may be counted multiple times if they were the victim of multiple offences belonging to different offence types within a single incident or reported multiple times during the reference period. They would be counted once for each most serious offence per offence type. Unless otherwise specified, victim data presented in this report do not represent a count of individual (unique) victims.

Unique victim: provides an estimate of the actual number of reported victims and therefore is lower than the total number of reported victims. Each person is counted once only in the reference period, regardless of how many times they have been reported as a victim of an offence.

Only offences with a status of *solved, withdrawn, lapsed* or *unsolved* are counted in this report.

Cancelled, not substantiated and unfounded crime reports have been excluded.








3.0 Reported and cleared offences

This section presents statistics for Queensland for 2020–21 and the year(s) immediately prior, for reported and cleared offences in three categories: offences against the person, against property, and other offences.

Reported offences are those which have been reported to or detected by police within the reference period, and include those where no offender, or victim in some cases, has been identified. These are presented as both numbers and rates, and a percentage change indicator. Rates are calculated as reported offences per 100,000 persons, using the appropriate estimated resident population (ERP).

Cleared offences are presented as a count of offences *reported and cleared in period* and *cleared in period, reported previously*. The *percentage cleared* figures, below, refer only to those offences reported and cleared in the same financial year. (See Glossary for definition of *cleared offences*.)

3.1. Reported offences

Counts and rates of reported offences for 2018–19, the year immediately preceding the COVID-19 pandemic, have been included in this section to help illustrate the impact of the pandemic and associated social restrictions on reported crime.



The tables in this section display the number of reported offences and the offence rate per 100,000 estimated resident population (ERP), for 2011–12, 2019–20 and 2020–21, for Queensland and the state's 19 statistical areas level 4.


Population growth can lead to a rise in numbers of offences, and therefore simple counts cannot and should not be used to gauge the true level of crime in a region. However, it is important to note that transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP. This would have particular impact on high tourism areas where crime rates may be overestimated.

Please note: The tables in this section include some offences where the SA4 in which the offence occurred cannot be identified. This may occur for one of two reasons:

(1) The offence was detected as part of a covert operation, and the location of the offence has not been recorded, to maintain security.

(2) The accuracy of the address had not been verified at the time the data were extracted for inclusion in this publication. In such cases, the offences have been included in the Queensland total only. Therefore, SA4 statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.



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

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



5.0 Crime locations

This section provides a breakdown of crime in 2020–21 by the type of location in which the reported offence occurred. The location classifications are based on those used by the ABS in *Recorded crime – Victims, Australia*.

A crime location is defined as the initial site where a criminal incident occurred, classified by the primary function of that site where the site has more than one function. This definition may encompass any surrounding land, yard or car parking area, together with any other structures existing at the location. (See Glossary for further information.)

6.0 Offenders

In this report, offender statistics do not represent a count of unique offenders, unless otherwise stated. Nor do they equate to the number of offences cleared. An individual may be recorded as an alleged offender multiple times, if they were proceeded against for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period.

The reference date used to generate statistics for the year under review is the date an action commenced against an alleged offender. As such, offenders proceeded against in the reference year, for matters reported in the same or in previous years, will be included in this report.

In 2020-21:

All offenders

- Counts of both total offenders and unique offenders decreased from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Three-quarters (74.9%) of all offenders were male.
- One-quarter (25.2%) of all offenders (18.7% of unique offenders) identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.
- Drug offences (22.9%) was the most prevalent offence type among all offenders in 2020–21.




Child offenders (aged 10–17 years at time of police action)

- Child offenders accounted for more than half of all offenders for both *robbery* (53.6%) and *unlawful use of motor vehicle* (53.0%) compared with 16.1% of all offenders for all offence types.
- Other theft (excl. unlawful entry) was the most prevalent offence among child offenders (9,037).

Compared with 2011–12

- Offender numbers for *breach domestic violence protection order* more than doubled (24,318 offenders from 10,524), the most significant increase of all offences (+131.1%).
- The number of female offenders increased by 30.7%, while male offenders increased by 8.0% over the same period.



6.1. Age and sex

Offender tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells (\leq 3) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered.

Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatory notes* for more detail.)

Offender age is reported as at date police action was commenced against them, not at date offence occurred. Be aware that, in some instances, such as homicide and sexual offences, the time difference may be considerable.





6.1.1. Sex of offender




Figure 9 Offenders by sex, Queensland

Police proceeded against 286,747 offenders in 2020–21 in relation to offences reported during the same year or in the year(s) prior. While this was a decrease of 39,249 offenders (–12.0%) over a year from 2019–20, it represents an increase of 32,993 offenders (+13.0%) over the 10–year time series. Since 2011–12, the number of offenders proceeded against increased steadily to reach the first peak of 325,330 in 2015–16 (Figure 9). It was then narrowly surpassed by the time-series high of 325,996 offenders in 2019–20.

In 2020–21, the number of male offenders decreased by 12.3% (–30,241), to 214,710 from 244,951 in 2019–20. Female offenders also decreased, by 11.2% (–9,060), to 71,796 from 80,856 in the previous year.

Males comprised 74.9% of all offenders in 2020–21, the lowest proportion recorded during the time series. This is a result of the number of female offenders increasing at a greater rate (+30.7%) than the number of male offenders (+8.0%) over the 10–year time series.





6.1.2. Age distribution

The age distribution of offenders has shifted towards older age groups since 2011–12 (Figure 10). Offender numbers decreased for 15–24-year-olds, while increasing slightly for 10–14-year-olds. For all age groups 25 years and older, offender numbers in each age group have increased between 12% (25–29-year-olds) and 71% (60 years and older).

The proportion of offenders aged under 25 years in 2020–21 was the lowest in ten years, down from 48.6% of all offenders proceeded against by police in 2011–12, to 36.6% in 2020–21.





6.2. Indigenous status




Figure 11 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders

In 2020–21, police in Queensland proceeded against 72,215 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders, a decrease of 8.4% from the 78,844 offenders recorded in the previous year (Figure 11). Over the 10–year time series, of all those offenders whose Indigenous status was stated, the proportion who identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander has increased slightly, to 25.3% in 2020–21 compared with 23.3% in 2011–12, with some minor fluctuations over the 10 year period.



6.2.2. Distribution by age, sex and Indigenous status




Figure 12 Non-Indigenous^(a) offenders by age group and sex^(b), 2020–21

The distribution of offenders proceeded against in 2020–21 by age, sex and Indigenous status shows different patterns for the offender cohorts. For non–Indigenous male offenders, the most common age group was 25–29 years, closely followed by 20–24 years and 15–19 years. Whereas for non–Indigenous female offenders, there was little difference between the age groups of 15–19 years through to 25–29 years, with a small peak at 30–34 years (Figure 12).



By comparison, the proportion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders aged under 20 years was almost double that of non-Indigenous offenders in the same age category (36.6% and 32.0% respectively for Indigenous male and female offenders compared with 18.0% and 18.9% for non–Indigenous male and female offenders) (Figure 13).

Of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders in 2020–21, the age group most represented was 15–19 years for both males (23.3%) and females (19.1%), with 10–14 years the second–most represented age group for males (13.3%). Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders aged 10–14 years accounted for 13.2% of all Indigenous offenders, whereas only 3.9% of all non-Indigenous offenders were in that age group.

6.3. Offence category and type

In this report, offences are classified into three broad categories: offences against the person (comprising 8.5% of offenders proceeded against by police in 2020–21); offences against property (27.5%); and other offences (64.1%), and then further disaggregated by offence type (Table 57).

The most prevalent offences for which police proceeded against an offender in 2020–21 were *drug offences* (22.9%), *good order offences* (13.4%) and *traffic and related offences* (13.0%). They have been the three most common offences in nine out of the ten years from 2011–12 to 2020–21, with 2019–20 the only exception.

Breach domestic violence protection order offences recorded the largest increase of offender numbers in 2020–21 compared with the previous year (+2,662 or +12.3%). Drug offences recorded the largest decrease over a year (-14,501 or -18.1%). However, this significant drop was not enough to offset the steady increase over the earlier eight years as *drug offences* recorded the largest increase of offender numbers from 2011–12 to 2020–21 (+22,501, or +52.2%).




The distribution of offenders in each offence category varied according to the age of the offender. While the proportion of offences against the person remained fairly stable regardless of the age of offender, younger offenders were substantially more likely to be proceeded against in relation to offences against property (61.7% of 10–16-year-old offenders). From 17 years of age, other offences overtook offences against property, with older offenders substantially more likely to be proceeded against for offences in this category (70.9% of offenders aged 20 years and over) (Figure 14).






Note: 60+ represents offenders aged 60 years and all ages above, while all other data points represent a single year of age.

Within the category of other offences, there is also an age pattern, although less pronounced (Figure 15). *Good order offences* accounted for 28.3% of child offenders (aged 10–17 years) with a steady decrease to 19.5% of offenders by 30 years of age. *Drug offences* became the predominant offence for offenders at 14 years and reached the peak at 17 years of age, and accounted for 35.8% of all offenders aged 14 years and over. *Traffic and related offences* rose above 20% for offenders aged 20 years and remained steady until a further rise for those aged late forties and peaking at 59 years (32.7%). The proportion of offenders proceeded against for *breach of domestic violence protection order* rose steadily with age and fluctuated above 15% for offenders aged from late twenties to early fifties.



The age distribution of offenders for selected person and property offences also shows an age pattern (Figure 16). Although many offence types roughly follow the overall pattern of offending, offenders aged 10–19 years are substantially over-represented for *unlawful entry* and *unlawful use of motor vehicle*, while older age groups from 45 years and over are over-represented for *sexual offences*.

It should be noted, however, that the reference date for offender statistics is the date police commenced action against an offender, and some offences reported in 2020–21 will have occurred in years prior.

6.4. Child offenders

6.4.1. Sex and Indigenous status

In 2020–21, police proceeded against 46,175 offenders aged 10–17 years in Queensland, a decrease of 11.0% from 51,865 in 2019–20. The level of decrease is similar for both males and females, and similar for both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non–Indigenous child offenders.




Figure 17 Child offenders by Indigenous status and sex^(a)

However, over the 10–year time series, the offending trend varies between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non–Indigenous child offenders, and between males and females (Figure 17).

The overall decreasing trend of non–Indigenous male child offenders resulted in a time series low of 18,830 in 2020–21, a 20.2% decrease from the peak of 23,601 in 2011–12.

In contrast, the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander male child offenders has fluctuated over the same period. The number of offenders (15,111) in 2020–21 was just below that in 2011–12 (15,373 offenders).

In this report, child offenders are those aged **10 to 17 years at time police action commenced against them**, for 2020–21 and across the time series.

OUEENSLAND TREASURY

Over the 10–year time series, the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female offenders has increased steadily from 4,129 in 2011–12 to 5,420 (+31.3%) in 2020–21, whereas the number of non–Indigenous female offenders has decreased slightly from 6,798 to 6,564 (–3.4%).

6.4.2. Offence type




Figure 18 Distribution of most prevalent offences by child offenders in 2020–21, compared with same offences in 2011–12

Six offences have accounted for three-quarters of all child offending in every year of the 10–year time series from 2011–12 to 2020–21 (Figure 18).


Other theft (excl. unlawful entry), has consistently been the most prevalent of these, albeit accounting for a smaller proportion of all child offenders in 2020–21 (19.6%) than in 2011–12 (23.3%). *Unlawful use of motor vehicle* rose to be the fourth-most prevalent offence by child offenders in 2020–21, recording the largest increase in the proportion of all child offenders, up 4.7 percentage points from 6.4% to 11.1%. Conversely, *other property damage* showed the largest decrease in the proportion of all child offenders, down 4.0 percentage points from 12.0% to 8.0%.


In number terms, in 2020–21 compared with 2011–12, the largest increase in child offenders was for *unlawful use of motor vehicle* offences (+1,899 offenders to 5,124) (Figure 19).

Conversely, other theft (excl. unlawful entry) showed the largest decrease in child offenders over the same period (down 2,682 offenders to 9,037), followed by other property damage (down 2,331 offenders to 3,686) and good order offences (–2,030 offenders to 3,912).

While child offenders accounted for about one-sixth (16.1%) of all offenders proceeded against by police in 2020–21, the largest proportion since 2017–18 (when it was 16.7%), this figure varied considerably across offence types.




Figure 20 Child offenders as proportion of all offenders, selected offences^(a), 2020–21

There were six offence types where child offenders accounted for more than double this proportion, and three where they comprised half or more of all offenders. *Robbery* was the highest of these, with 53.6% of all offenders aged between 10 and 17 years, closely followed by *unlawful use of motor vehicle* at 53.0% and *unlawful entry* at 50.4% (Figure 20).

6.5. Unique offenders




Figure 21 Count and rate of unique offenders by Indigenous status

There were 104,591 unique offenders in Queensland in 2020–21, a decrease of 3.3% from 108,132 unique offenders in the previous year (Figure 21). This was mainly due to a decrease in non-Indigenous offenders (–3,627 or –4.1%), which was offset slightly by an increase in offenders identified as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (+111 or +0.6%).

The number of unique offenders in 2020–21 was at its lowest in the 10–year time series, a decrease of 16.2% from the peak in 2015–16.

The decreased count in 2020–21 has resulted in the Queensland unique offender rate continuing its steady downward trend from the time-series peak of 2,999.3 offenders per 100,000 persons in 2014–15, to 2,291.8 offenders in 2020–21.

6.5.1. Age, sex and Indigenous status

The distribution of unique offenders in 2020–21 by age, sex and Indigenous status displayed a similar pattern for both non-Indigenous and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders.






Figure 22 Non-Indigenous^(a) unique offenders by age and sex^(b), 2020–21

For both male and female non–Indigenous offenders, the most highly–represented age group was 20–24 years, as it has been in previous years, with numbers decreasing steadily through the older age groups, until the 60 years and over age group (Figure 22).

Age of unique offender is reported as at date of *first* police action against them in the reference year.

(b) Excludes a further 133 non-Indigenous unique offenders whose sex was not stated.


The 20–24 years age group was also the most highly represented for both male and female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander unique offenders, closely followed by the 15–19 years and 25–29 years age groups before steadily declining through every older age group (Figure 23).

6.5.2. Age distribution





Figure 24 Unique offenders by age group

The age distribution of unique offenders has shifted towards older age groups since 2011–12 (Figure 24). In 2020–21, unique offender numbers were lower in every age group under 30 years but higher in every age group 30 years and over when comparing with each age group in 2011–12.

There were 10,597 unique child offenders in 2020–21, a 26.8% decrease from 14,476 in 2011–12. The unique child offender rate also continued its steady decline to 1,956.4 per 100,000 persons aged 10–17 years, the lowest level recorded over the time series (Figure 25).

While the unique adult offender rate has been higher than the unique child offender rate since overtaking it in 2012–13, it too declined to its lowest level in 10 years, with 2,336.9 unique adult offenders per 100,000 persons aged 18 years and over. The total number of unique offenders aged 18 years and over proceeded against by police decreased 2.2% from 96,121 in 2011–12 to 93,994 in 2020–21.

7.0 Victims of offences against the person

In this report, victim statistics relate to offences against the person only, and they relate only to offences reported to or detected by police. They do not represent a count of unique victims unless otherwise stated. Victim statistics are compiled on the basis of one victim per counted offence type within a single report to police.

Statistics are compiled on the basis of the date an offence was reported to/detected by police, regardless of when the offence occurred. In some instances, particularly with homicide and sexual offences, there may be a large time difference between when the offence occurred and the report/detection date.

- The victimisation rate increased significantly to be the highest in the 10-year time series, at 826.7 reported victims per 100,000 persons.
- 57.5% of reported victims with stated offender-victim relationship knew their offenders.
- 14.0% of all reported victims (excluding those whose Indigenous status was not stated) identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.

Assault accounted for almost 7 in 10 reported victims

- Nearly one-quarter of all reported assault victims were aged 20–29 years.
- 57.0% of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female assault victims were in a family or domestic relationship with their offender, compared with 39.3% of non–Indigenous female reported victims.




7.1. Reported victims

The Queensland Police Service recorded 43,131 victims of offences against the person in 2020–21, a 21.8% increase on the previous year (35,411 reported victims in 2019–20) (Figure 26).

The sharp increase in reported victims in 2020–21 continued the recent upward trend in Queensland's reported victimisation rate from a low of 534.3 victims per 100,000 persons in 2014–15, to a 10-year high of 826.7 victims in 2020–21. In particular, the increase of 137.1 victims per 100,000 persons over the year to 2020–21 contributed almost half of the total increase of 292.4 victims per 100,000 person over the six-year period since 2014–15.

The increase in reported victims in 2020–21 was observed for both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims and non-Indigenous victims, with increases of 20.0% and 20.9% respectively. Meanwhile, the number of victims with no stated Indigenous status increased by 887 or 35.9% on the previous year.





7.1.1. Age and sex

Victim's age is as at date offence was reported to or detected by police, not at date offence occurred.

Be aware that, in some instances, particularly *homicide* and *sexual offences*, the time difference may be considerable.

Victim tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells (\leq 3) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered.

Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatorv notes* for more detail.)

7.1.2. Offence type

Assault accounted for 7 in 10 reported victims in 2020–21

Assault offences accounted for seven in ten (69.5% or 29,966) reported victims of offences against the person in Queensland in 2020–21 (Table 59). Assault is the direct (and immediate/confrontational) infliction of force, injury or violence upon a person or persons, or the direct (and immediate/confrontational) threat of force, injury or violence where there is an apprehension that the threat could be enacted. Assault accounted for a considerably greater proportion of male victims than female victims (81.3% and 59.6% respectively).

This offence type is further disaggregated on the basis of whether or not the assault involved injury, or other aggravating circumstances. In 2020–21, the two most prevalent types of assault experienced by victims in Queensland were *serious assault* and *common assault* (43.5% and 38.8% respectively of total assault).

While *assault* offences accounted for a greater proportion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims than non-Indigenous victims (77.5% compared with 70.4%), the sex profile was also notably different between these victim cohorts. Females accounted for 67.4% of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander assault victims, with more female than male victims recorded across almost all assault offence types, except for *grievous assault*. In comparison, females accounted for a much lower proportion (42.7%) of all non–Indigenous assault victims, with more male than female victims recorded across all assault offence types.

Sexual offences accounted for 15.2% of all reported victims in 2020–21. Females comprised more than four in five (86.6% or 5,665) of all reported victims of sexual offences, a proportion consistent across both the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non–Indigenous victim cohorts. Among sexual offences, other sexual offences accounted for the majority of reported victims (64.2% compared with 35.8% for rape and attempted rape).

Homicide offences and *robbery* accounted for 0.3% and 4.3% respectively of all reported victims in 2020–21, with males comprising a higher number of reported victims across both offence types.



The number of reported *assault* victims increased 49.8% (+9,963 victims) in 2020–21 compared with 2011–12. This increase included +5,797 victims in 2020–21, and more than half of these were victims of *common assault* (3,321) (Table 60). Similarly, reported *sexual offences* victims increased 56.3% (+2,356) since the beginning of the series, with the largest increase recorded in 2020–21 (+1,348, or +26.0% compared with 2019–20).




Proportion-wise, *assault* has consistently accounted for around 70% of all victims of offences against the person over the 10–year time series and, of these, *serious assault* consistently makes up the largest proportion (Figure 27).

Sexual offences have accounted for between 14.7% and 17.3% of reported victims over the time series.

7.1.3. Age and sex, for selected offences

The age and sex profiles of reported victims can differ significantly depending on the offence type, as demonstrated below for the selected offence types of *assault* and *sexual offences*. Age data presented in this report refer to the victim's age on the date the offence was reported/detected, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred.





Figure 28 Victims^(a) of assault, 2020–21

In 2020–21, reported victims of *assault* showed similar age distribution for both male and female victims. Females aged 20–29 years represented the largest single cohort of all female reported assault victims in 2020–21 (3,630 victims, or 26.1%) (Figure 28). This age group was also the largest cohort of all male assault victims in the same period (3,602 reported victims, or 22.6%). While the numbers of both male and female assault victims steadily declined with each successive age group after 20–29 years, reported victims in the 50–59 years and the 60 years and over age groups were 1.6 times more likely to be male than female. In fact, males outnumbered females across almost age groups for reported assault victims, with the exception of those aged 10–29 years.

(a) Chart excludes records for 67 reported assault victims whose age and/or sex was unknown or not stated.





Compared with reported assault victims, the age and sex profile of reported victims of *sexual offences* was disproportionate, with females outnumbering male victims in every age category, at a ratio ranging from 2.5 times (0–9 years) to 9.8 times (20–29 years) (Figure 29).

Although the most prevalent age group for both male and female reported victims of sexual offences was 10–19 years, the number of females in this age cohort significantly outnumbered males, resulting in the single largest group of reported victims of this offence type in 2020–21 (39.6% of all whose age and sex were identified).

7.1.4. Reported victimisation rate

Age-standardisation is a technique used to enhance the comparability of event rates from different populations or sub-populations over time by making adjustments for the confounding effects of differences in age structure between the populations being compared. Age–standardised victimisation rates in 2020–21 varied markedly according to the Indigenous status and sex of the victim, as well as offence type. Figure 30 demonstrates this variability for *sexual offences* and the subcategories of *assault* offences.


Across each of the offences shown, both male and female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons recorded higher victimisation rates than non-Indigenous persons.

The victimisation rates for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons were consistently higher for females than males across all offences shown, except for *grievous assault*.

Comparatively, non-Indigenous victims were more likely to be male, with this cohort experiencing higher victimisation rates than non-Indigenous females, except for *sexual offences*.

Across the offences shown, female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims of *serious assault* recorded the highest victimisation rate in 2020–21, at a rate of 1,248 victims per 100,000 persons. This rate was equivalent to a rate ratio of almost seven times the rate for non-Indigenous females.

However, the largest rate ratio in 2020–21 was observed for female victims of *grievous assault*, where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander females were 15 times as likely as non-Indigenous females to be a victim of this offence (at a rate of 90 victims per 100,000 persons compared with six per 100,000 non-Indigenous females).

Relationship is recorded at time offence was reported, and relationship classifications used are derived from those used by the ABS in *Recorded crime – Victims, Australia*.




Figure 31 Relationship of offender to victim^(a), by Indigenous status and sex of victim^(b), selected offences, 2020–21

Nearly 6 in 10 reported victims of offences against the person knew their offender Across all offences against the person in 2020–21 where the offender–victim relationship was recorded, 57.5% of reported victims in Queensland knew their offender.² The nature of the relationship between the offender and the victim varied markedly according to the sex and Indigenous status of the victim, as well as the offence type. Figure 31 demonstrates this divergence for the selected offence types of *assault* and *sexual offences*.

Notably, four in five (79.3%) Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female victims of *assault* knew their offender, with more than half of all victims (57.0%) in a family or domestic relationship with the offender. By comparison, non–Indigenous females were less likely than Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female assault victims to have known their offender (64.5%) and much less likely to have been in a family or domestic relationship with the offender (39.3%).

Non–Indigenous male assault victims were more likely than all other assault victims to have been offended against by a person(s) unknown to them (47.1%), and the least likely to be in a family or domestic relationship with their offender (13.4%).

Across all reported victims of *sexual offences*, around three in four victims knew their offender. Among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims, females were more likely than males to be in a family or domestic relationship with their offender (43.4% compared with 33.3%), while for non–Indigenous persons, females and males shared a similar likelihood (34.0% compared with 32.4%). Of all reported victims of sexual offences, non–Indigenous females were the cohort most likely to have been offended against by a person(s) unknown to them (18.1%).

7.1.6. Reported victimisation rate of DFV-related offences by Indigenous status

Please note: DFV-related offences presented in this report relate only to offences against the person and do not take into account DFV-related property or other offences that may occur. They represent those offences against the person where reported victims indicated to police they were in a domestic or family relationship with the offender, and which the victim agreed for police to progress. It is also important to note that, during the reporting period, where a DFV incident occurred which involved an alleged assault and the victim did not consent to proceeding with an assault charge, the assault matter was not recorded by police in QPRIME and therefore will not be included in reported offences.

Data describing the relationship of offender to victim are used as one of the sources for identifying domestic and family violence (DFV)–related offences (Table 61). However, a proportion of victims of offences against the person (for example, 9.8% in 2020–21) have no information recorded about the relationship between the offender and victim. Because of this, and the counting rules used to record assault incidents, DFV–related offences against the person data in this report may under-represent the number of these offences in Queensland.

Across all offences against the person in 2020–21 where offender–victim relationship was recorded, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims were almost twice as likely as non-Indigenous victims to be offended against by someone with whom they were in a family or domestic relationship (48.7% compared with 27.2%). Further, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims were almost twice as likely as non-Indigenous victims to be offended against by a partner or expartner in 2020–21 (26.7% compared with 15.1%).

However, examination of reported victimisation rates for DFV-related person offences by age and sex reveals the substantial variation in experiences within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous reported victim cohorts. It must be remembered that, in this report, a victim's age is based on the date the offence was reported to or detected by police, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred, and some offences will have occurred in years prior to 2020–21.


In 2020–21, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female victimisation rates for DFV-related person offences increased with age, peaking at 3,120 victims per 100,000 persons for females aged 20–29 years, closely followed by females aged 30–39 years (3,112 per 100,000 persons), before declining steeply with each successive age group (Figure 32).


In contrast, victimisation rates for non-Indigenous females remained within a much smaller, and relatively flat, range with a high at 10–17 years of age (452 victims per 100,000 persons) and then peaking at 20–29 years of age (487 per 100,000 persons). The victimisation rate then declined slightly with each successive age group.


Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander females aged between 0–17 years experienced victimisation rates for DFV-related offences between two and four times that of non-Indigenous females. This differential in rates was larger among adult female victims, with rates for those cohorts aged 18 years and over ranging between six and nine times those of non–Indigenous female victims. The largest rate ratio was for women aged 60 years and over, with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women nine times more likely to be a victim of a DFV-related offence than non-Indigenous women in 2020–21.

Victimisation rates for DFV-related offences among non-Indigenous males peaked at 10–17 years of age, at 186 victims per 100,000 persons, then dropped to half of that rate (92) at 18–19 years of age, followed by a much flatter line as it did for non-Indigenous females. In contrast, the victimisation rate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males was second-highest at 10–17 years of age (at 530 victims per 100,000 persons) but peaked at 40–49 years of age (599 per 100,000 persons). The largest rate ratio of all age groups was in the 50–59 years age group, with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males victimised at around nine times the rate of non-Indigenous males.

Overall, except for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander females aged 0–9 years, both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous females experienced markedly higher DFV–related victimisation rates than all males across all other age groups.


7.2. Unique victims




Figure 33 Count and rate of unique victims, offences against the person

In 2020–21, QPS recorded a total of 36,981 unique victims of offences against the person, a 21.2% increase on the previous year (+6,472 unique victims)(Figure 33).

Since the time-series low in 2014–15, the number of unique victims has been increasing steadily but slowly until 2020–21, when the sharp increase over one year (+6,472) accounted for 43.6% of the total increase over six years (+14,589 unique victims).

Similarly, the unique victimisation rate has been rising steadily since 2014–15 and plateaued in the three years prior to 2020–21. The time-series high of 708.8 victims per 100,000 persons in 2020–21 was 19.3% higher than in 2019–20 and reflected the significant increase of unique victims over the year to June 2021.

Both the count and rate of unique victims of person offences reached a 10–year high in 2020–21



7.2.1. Indigenous status

The large increase in unique victims from 2019–20 to 2020–21 occurred for both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous persons, with an increase of 18.2% and 20.2% respectively (Figure 33).

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons represented 13.2% of all unique victims in 2020–21 (where Indigenous status was stated). This is disproportionate to the representation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons in Queensland's overall population (4.7% at 30 June 2020).³

7.2.2. Age and sex




Figure 34 Unique victims, offences against the person, by age and sex^(a), 2020–21




Figure 35 Unique victims, offences against the person, by age and sex^(a), 2011–12

In 2020–21, unique victims were more likely to be female than male across all younger age groups from 0 to 39 years, as they were in three out of the four previous years, while across older age groups (aged 40 years and over) unique victims were more likely to be male than female (Figure 34). Over the10–year time series, there has been a trend of unique female victims increasingly outnumbering unique male victims in the younger age groups. In 2011–12, only the victims aged 10–19 years were more likely to be female than male (Figure 35). The first year that unique female victims outnumbered males in all age groups from 0 to 29 years was 2015–16, and the following year was the first year they also outnumbered males in the 0 to 39 years age groups.

In 2020–21, unique victims aged 0–39 years were more likely to be female with those aged 40+ years more likely to be male.

Females aged 10–19 years represented the largest single group of unique victims in 2020–21 (4,948 or 13.4% of all victims with both age and sex identified), closely followed by females aged 20-29 years (4,801 or 13.0%). This is indicative of the large number of victims of sexual offences and assault for these two cohorts. Persons aged 0–9 years have comprised the smallest unique victim cohort overall since 2018–19 when it was outnumbered by the cohort aged 60 years and over.

(a) Chart excludes 105 persons whose sex and/or age was not stated.

Glossary

Age standardisation: a statistical method used to enhance the comparability of event rates from different population or sub-population groups over time by making adjustments for the confounding effects of differences in **age** structure between the populations being compared—e.g. the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous populations.

Cleared offences: An offence is deemed to be cleared under, but not restricted to, one of the following circumstances:

- Police action* has been taken against an offender.
- The offender has died or been admitted to a psychiatric facility before police have proceeded with a charge.
- The offender has diplomatic immunity.
- The offender is serving a sentence and no useful purpose would be served by prosecution.
- The offender is a child and no further action will be taken in accordance with *Youth Justice Act 1992*.
- There is a bar to prosecution (e.g. defences and exculpations under the *Criminal Code Act 1899*, or other Queensland statutes).
- The offender is being dealt with by another agency apart from QPS (e.g. RSPCA or other Queensland Government department).
- There is sufficient evidence to determine that the offender committed the offence but will not be charged as it is not in the public interest.
- There is sufficient evidence to determine the offender committed the offence but none of the offences can be sufficiently particularised to commence a prosecution.
- The victim is too young to proceed without sufficient corroboration to support their testimony.
- There is sufficient evidence to determine that the offender committed the offence but will not be charged as the offence was committed against a child who has been interviewed but did not sufficiently disclose the abuse and without other evidence the case cannot proceed.
- The victim or essential witness has died prior to the offender being charged.

• The victim formally withdraws the complaint and no longer wishes to continue with the complaint.

The recovery of stolen or otherwise unlawfully obtained property does not in itself clear or solve an offence.

***Police action type:** Police may proceed against an offender in any of the following ways:

Arrest: The taking into custody of an offender to compel that person's appearance before a court.

Summons: A direction or command issued by a magistrate or justice of the peace to an offender to appear before a court with reference to a matter described therein, at a given time and place.

Notice to appear: A notice issued and personally served by a police officer upon an offender whom he/she reasonably suspects has committed / is committing an offence, to appear before a court, with reference to a matter described therein, at a stated time and place.

Warrant: An authority under the hand of a judge or justice of the peace to arrest an offender in order that the person may be dealt with according to the law.

Caution: An official caution administered to a child under the provisions of the Youth Justice Act and includes the cautioning of persons over 65 years of age and intellectually disabled persons for minor criminal offences in accordance with official QPS policy. The term does not apply to any informal process where a child is spoken to by an officer where the officer is exercising discretion in relation to the child's particular behaviour or actions.

Community conference: The referral of a child under the provisions of the Youth Justice Act to community conference by a police officer before the start of a proceeding for an offence, or by court after a finding of guilty is made against a child for the offence.

Other: The offender is known and sufficient evidence has been obtained but there is a bar to prosecution or other official process.

Confidentialisation: a change made to small-value cells (\leq 3) in aggregated person-related data (see Notes).

Crime location: Refers to the initial site where a criminal incident occurred, determined based on primary use or function. Surrounding land, yard or parking area connected to a building or other structure are assigned to the same category of use. If a location serves more than one function, they are classified per the primary function.

Administration or Professional includes business, government.

Dwelling includes boarding house, motel, unit, other dwelling.

Educational includes school, university, TAFE, library. **Health** includes hospital, hospital grounds, medical.

Justice includes court, police station, correctional centre.

Open space includes beach, boat ramp, bushland, crown land, river, waterway.

Other n.e.c. includes construction site, mail, military area, rest area.

Recreational includes adult entertainment, brothel, caravan park, cinema, night club, gaming.

Retail includes chemist, food shop, garage, hotel, licensed premises, restaurant, Post Office, shopping centre.

Transport includes airport, carpark, railway, terminal, wharf, train, in transit.

Offence: Any act or omission by a person or persons for which a penalty could be imposed by the Australian legal system.

Offences are presented under three broad categories: offences against the person, against property, and other offences. They are further disaggregated and grouped by offence type.

Offender: A person aged 10 years or over who, through the clearance of an offence, is alleged to be responsible for committing that offence.

Child offender: in this report, an alleged offender aged 10 to 17 years on the date police action commenced against them.

Population subgroup: In this report, this term is used where rates are calculated for each age group by Indigenous status and sex. It refers to the portion of the population to which a statistic pertains, e.g. non-Indigenous females aged 10–17 years.

Victim: For most offences against the person, 'the victim' is an individual person. In some cases, such as robbery and extortion, the victim may be an individual person or an organisation. Only person victims have been included in this report.

Notes

The information displayed in this report may vary from data published elsewhere by QGSO and others, due to differences in the dates data were extracted and frequency of revision, or in counting rules or statistical standards applied. Readers are urged to exercise caution when making comparison between publications.

Data in this report have not been tested to determine whether changes over time are statistically significant.

Source – QPRIME: All crime statistics presented in this report are derived from unpublished data recorded in official crime reports in QPRIME, supplied by QPS and collated by QGSO. **Data were current at the time of extraction, 10 August 2021**, and are subject to change.

Age:

Victim age data presented in this report refer to the victim's age on the date the offence was reported/detected, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred. Particular care should be exercised when interpreting age data for sexual assault victims.

Offender age data presented in this report refer to the offender's age on the date the offence was cleared/actioned by police, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred or the offence was reported/detected.

Confidentialisation:

Confidentialising data involves removing or altering information or collapsing detail (through application of statistical disclosure controls) to mitigate the risk that a person may be identified in the data (either directly or indirectly).

Victim and alleged offender tables contain person-based variables and include demographic information. Therefore, such tables in this report are subject to confidentialisation to ensure the anonymity of individuals is protected where numbers are small and there is a reasonable likelihood that a person may be identified from the data published. This process is applied to aggregated data only prior to release. QGSO has confidentialised cells in offender and victim–related tables with values ranging from 1 to 3. This is denoted in the tables by the number ' \leq 3' appearing in cells with small values. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered.

For the purpose of calculating row and column totals, each cell with a value of 1 to 3 is assigned a value of 2, regardless of the true value of that cell. This methodology allows for totals to be calculated in tables with small value cells, but this does mean that totals for certain variables may not be the same across tables within the report.

Counting methodology: This report uses counting rules originally developed by the ABS and used by Queensland Police for the publication of crime statistics relating to reported offences against the person, victims and offenders. The following counting rules have been applied in this publication.

Offences: For offences against the person, for each victim within a distinct criminal incident (occurrence), the most serious offence (MSO) per offence type is counted. A single criminal incident may therefore result in several offences being recorded.

Sexual offences, which includes 'Rape and attempted rape' and 'Other sexual offences', is the **exception to the national counting rule**. The counting rule applied in respect of this group of offences is that, for each victim, the MSO per offence type is counted on the basis of time and place.

For offences against property and other offences, no national counting rules exist and, for such offences, each distinct criminal act per criminal incident is counted.

Offenders: Count of one for each unique reported offence type cleared or solved through police action against an individual offender within a single incident, for a specified geographic area and period. An individual offender is counted multiple times during the reference period, if they were proceeded against for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period.

Unique offenders: An individual offender is counted only once during the reference period, irrespective of the number of offences committed within the same incident or the number of times they were dealt with by police.

Victims: For each reported victim within a distinct criminal incident, the MSO per offence type is counted. Where the same individual is subjected to multiple offences belonging to different offence types within a single incident, then, in accordance with the MSO counting rule, that victim is counted multiple times (once for each MSO per offence type). Only victims of offences against the person are presented in this report.

Unique victims: An individual victim is counted once only in the reference period, regardless of how many times they have been reported as a victim of an offence (against the person).

Geography:

In the **main report**, all data are presented at state (Queensland) level. Number and rate of offences are also presented in tables for Queensland's 19 statistical areas level 4 (SA4) under the ASGS.

These tables include some offences where the SA4 in which the offence occurred cannot be identified. This may occur for one of two reasons:

The offence was detected as part of a covert operation, and the location of the offence has not been recorded, to maintain security; or

The accuracy of the address has not been determined at the time that the data were extracted for inclusion in this publication. That is, the address was not verified.

In these cases, the offences have been included in the Queensland total only. Therefore, SA4 statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.

In the **Appendix**, all data are presented by Queensland Police Service administrative regions (seven police regions and 15 police districts).

In cases where the police region in which the offence occurred cannot be identified (for reasons outlined above), the offences have been included in the Queensland total only. Therefore, police region statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.

Indigenous status: based on self-identification by the individual who comes into contact with police as one of the following four standard options:

Neither Aboriginal nor Torres Strait Islander (non-Indigenous); Aboriginal; Torres Strait Islander; Both Aboriginal <u>and</u> Torres Strait Islander.

In this publication, the term 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander' is used to refer to any person who identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.

Indigenous status of victim/offender has not been identified in a relatively small number of offences, and these are quantified in the table footnotes where applicable.

Offence classification: Offence codes and groupings presented in this publication are those used by QPS and are based on the Australian National Classification of Offences (ANCO, 1985).

Interpreting rates: Rates are calculated per 100,000 persons, using the appropriate estimated resident population (ERP) of the specified region, published by the ABS, as at 30 June.

Offence rate is calculated as:

number of offences ERP *100,000

using the mid-point ERP for the reference year (e.g. average of ERP as at 30 June 2020 plus ERP as at 30 June 2021 for the 2020–21 reference year).

Unique offender rate: Expressed as the number of unique offenders per 100,000 of the estimated resident population (ERP) aged 10 years and over.

Unique victim rate: Expressed as the number of unique victims per 100,000 of the total estimated resident population (ERP).

Rates enable comparison of crime to be made over time and between geographical areas, since the size of the population is taken into account in the calculation. However, comparisons of crime rates should be interpreted with caution due to the many factors which differ from region to region, including: the composition of its population (age, sex, ethnicity and employment); climate and geographical features; the economic structure (including local industry and the level and distribution of income).

It should be noted also that transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP. This would have particular impact on high tourism areas where crime rates may be overestimated.

Reference date: The reference date for reported offences and victims is the date an offence is reported to or detected by police. For cleared offences, the reference date is the date the

offence was cleared by police. For offender statistics, the reference date is the date an action is commenced.

Reference year: Years quoted in this report are financial year (i.e. from 1 July to 30 June). Statistics produced on the basis of date reported may be affected over time by lags in completing and/or processing some crime reports. Where offences reported in the reference year are not processed for inclusion until the following year, revised data will be presented in subsequent publications. As such, time series data published in this publication may vary from data published previously by Queensland Police Service.

Time series data are presented for ten financial years, from 1 July 2011 to 30 June 2021.

Variables not stated

In 2020-21 there were:


- 3,358 reported victims for whom Indigenous status was not stated, 74 reported victims for whom sex was not stated, and 46 reported victims for whom age was not stated (note – some records had more than one variable not stated)
- 3,129 unique victims for whom Indigenous status was not stated, 71 unique victims for whom sex was not stated, and 44 unique victims for whom age was not stated (note – some records had more than one variable not stated).
- 972 reported offenders whose Indigenous status was not stated and 241 reported offenders whose sex was not stated (note – some records had more than one variable not stated)
- 777 unique offenders whose Indigenous status was not stated and 144 unique offenders whose sex was not stated (note – some records had more than one variable not stated).

All data comparisons presented by Indigenous status exclude records where Indigenous status was not stated.

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1.0 Introduction

The Appendix: Crime report, Queensland Police Service administrative regions, 2020–21 comprises a series of tables and graphs and supplements the Crime report, Queensland 2020–21. Statistics relating to reported and cleared offences, victims of offences against the person and offenders in all offence categories are featured and are presented by police administrative regions (Figure A1).

Statistics in this supplementary report are also presented as both counts and rates. Using counts to gauge the level of crime is problematic, as areas with larger populations will presumably have higher numbers of offences than areas with smaller populations. Calculation of rates per 100,000 population allows direct comparisons of recorded crime to be made across different geographical areas and across time, since the size of the population is taken into account in the calculation.

Data which form the basis of this report are derived from official crime reports recorded in Queensland Police Records and Information Management Exchange (QPRIME). Only offences with a status of solved, withdrawn, lapsed or unsolved are counted in this report. Cancelled, not substantiated, and unfounded crime reports have been excluded.

The information presented in this report may vary from data published elsewhere by QGSO and others, due to differences in the dates data were extracted and frequency of revision, or in counting rules or statistical standards applied. Readers are therefore urged to exercise caution when making comparison between publications.

The statistics presented in this report should also be read in conjunction with the Explanatory notes and glossary in the main report, where counting methodologies and other supporting information are provided to aid in the interpretation of rates and numbers presented.

Only offences with a status of *solved, withdrawn, lapsed* or *unsolved* are counted in this report.

Cancelled, not substantiated and *unfounded* crime reports have been excluded.

2.0 Reported and cleared offences by police region and district

In this section, detailed tables of the number and rate of reported and cleared offences are presented for the seven QPS administrative regions (Brisbane, Central, Far Northern, North Coast, Northern, South Eastern and Southern) and the police districts within each of them, for the 2020–21 financial year. While the map below also includes police divisions, no data are presented for this smaller geographical area.

Please note: The tables in this section include some offences where the police district in which the offence occurred cannot be identified. This may occur for one of two reasons:

(1) The offence was detected as part of a covert operation, and the location of the offence has not been recorded, to maintain security.

(2) The accuracy of the address had not been verified at the time the data were extracted for inclusion in this publication.

In such cases, the offences have been included in the available geographical level only. Therefore, police region statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.




Figure A1 Queensland Police Service regions, districts and divisions, 2020–21





3.0 Regional comparisons

The graphs in this section display changes in the rate of selected offences per 100,000 estimated resident population (ERP), from 2019–20 to 2020–21, for Queensland and the seven Queensland Police Service regions: Brisbane, Central, Far Northern, North Coast, Northern, South Eastern and Southern.

Expressing offences in terms of rate per 100,000 persons enables the recorded crime level of a region to be compared with itself over time and with that of other regions.

Population growth can lead to a rise in numbers of offences, and therefore simple counts cannot and should not be used to gauge the true level of crime in a region. However, it is important to note that transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP. This would have particular impact on high tourism areas where crime rates may be overestimated.

Offence data by region are expressed as rate per 100,000 estimated resident population. Transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP.










Figure A4 Other homicide offences^{(a)(b)}, by police region






Figure A6 Grievous assault^(a), by police region






Figure A8 Serious assault (other)^(a), by police region






Figure A10 Sexual offences – all, by police region





Figure A12 Other sexual offences^(a), by police region





Figure A14 Armed robbery, by police region






Figure A16 Other offences against the person – all^(a), by police region





Figure A18 Extortion, by police region




Figure A20 Life endangering acts^(a), by police region




Figure A21 Offences against property – all offences, by police region





Figure A22 Unlawful entry – all, by police region






Figure A24 Unlawful entry with intent – shop, by police region






Figure A26 Arson, by police region






Figure A28 Unlawful use of motor vehicle, by police region






Figure A30 Fraud, by police region




Figure A32 Other offences – all offences, by police region






Figure A33 Drug offences, by police region






Figure A35 Breach of domestic violence protection order, by police region





Figure A37 Weapons Act offences, by police region




Figure A39 Traffic and related offences, by police region



4.0 Offenders by age and sex, by police region

This section presents statistics about offenders proceeded against by police, by Queensland Police Region.

An offender is any person aged 10 years or over who, through the clearance of an offence, is deemed to be responsible for committing that offence.


In this report, offender statistics refer to the number of offences cleared or solved through an action against an offender. They do not represent a count of unique offenders, nor do they equate to the number of offences cleared. An individual may be recorded as an offender multiple times, if they were proceeded against for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period.

The reference date used to generate statistics for the year under review is the date an action commenced against an offender, regardless of when the offence occurred. As such, offenders proceeded against in the reference year, for matters reported in the same or in previous years, will be included in this report.

Figures in the following tables do not represent a count of unique offenders, as an individual may be recorded as an offender once or multiple times in the reporting period.

> Offender's age is reported as at date police action was commenced against them, not at date offence occurred. Be aware that, in some instances, the time difference may be considerable.

To protect the anonymity of individuals, offender tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells (\leq 3) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered. Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatory notes* for more detail.)



5.0 Victims of offences against the person, by police region

This section presents statistics about victims of offences against the person, by Queensland Police Region.

In this report, victim statistics relate only to victims of offences against the person, reported to or detected by police within the reporting period. For most offences against the person 'the victim' is an individual person. Offences where the victim was an organisation have not been included in this report.

The statistics are compiled on the basis of one victim per counted offence type within a single report to police, and do not represent a count of unique victims. A person may be counted multiple times if they were the victim of multiple offences being to different offence types within a single incident or reported multiple times during the reference period. They would be counted once for each most serious offence per offence type.

The reference date for the year under review is the date an offence was reported to/detected by police, regardless of when the offence occurred. In some instances, particularly with homicide and sexual offences, there may be a large time difference between when the offence occurred and the report/detection date.

Victim's age is reported as at date offence was reported to / detected by police, not at date offence occurred. Be aware that, in some instances, the time difference may be considerable.

> Figures in the following tables do not represent a count of unique victims, as an individual may be recorded as a victim once or multiple times in the reporting period.

> > To protect the anonymity of individuals, victim tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells (\leq 3) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered. Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatory notes* for more detail.)

5.2. Relationship of offender to victim
