

# 1.0 Introduction

The *Crime report, Queensland, 2021–22* provides an overview of the volume and nature of crime in Queensland, as reported to (by victims, witnesses or other persons), or detected by, the Queensland Police Service (QPS) (recorded offences). The report is a companion to the *Justice report, Queensland, 2021–22* (also produced by the Queensland Government Statistician's Office), which provides an overview of the volume of criminal justice matters in Queensland, and includes statistics relating to criminal courts, youth justice, and adult corrective services.

For the purposes of this report, the reference period is the 2021–22 financial year and time series for up to 10 years.

This 2021–22 edition is the fifth annual report by the Queensland Government Statistician's Office (QGSO) on recorded crime in the state and includes revisions to data published for earlier years where appropriate. Detailed statistics relating to recorded victims of offences against the person and alleged offenders in all offence categories are featured in this report, as well as statistics for recorded and cleared offences.

Tables containing person-based variables and demographic information have been subjected to confidentialisation to ensure the anonymity of individuals is protected where numbers are small (fewer than 4) and there is a reasonable likelihood that a person may be identified from the data published.

Statistics in this report are presented as both counts and rates. Using counts to gauge the level of crime is problematic, as areas with larger populations will presumably have higher numbers of offences than areas with smaller populations. Calculation of rates per 100,000 estimated resident population allows direct comparisons of recorded crime to be made across different geographical areas and across time, since the size of the population is taken into account in the calculation.

Data which form the basis of this report are derived from official crime reports recorded in Queensland Police Records and Information Management Exchange (QPRIME). Only offences with a status of solved, withdrawn, lapsed or unsolved are counted in this report. Cancelled and unfounded (not substantiated) crime reports have been excluded.

This report presents crime for the state and the 19 statistical areas level 4 (SA4), as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) in the *Australian Statistical Geography Standard (ASGS)*. Also presented in the Appendix are crime statistics by QPS administrative regions.

The information presented in this report may vary from data published elsewhere by QGSO and others, due to differences in the dates administrative data were extracted and frequency of revision, or in counting rules or statistical standards applied. Readers are therefore urged to exercise caution when making comparison between publications.

The report should also be read in conjunction with the Explanatory notes and glossary, where counting methodologies and other supporting information are provided to aid in the interpretation of statistics presented.

## 1.1. COVID-19 pandemic

While the Australian border remained closed for the first half of 2021–22, the Queensland state border was intermittently opened and closed to other states and territories, depending on COVID-19 activity at the time. From mid-December 2021, Queensland borders re-opened fully for domestic travellers, followed closely by international visitors from January 2022. These changes lead to a boost in the state's population growth rate to 2.0% over the reporting period. This increase comprised net interstate migration of 55,418 persons, net overseas migration of 23,430 persons, and 27,647 through natural increase.<sup>1</sup>

Since the pandemic was declared, police in Queensland were deployed to ensure compliance with public health directives, including border control and mandatory quarantine, while maintaining business as usual policing activities. In April 2022, the *COVID-19 Emergency Response Act 2020* expired, marking the cessation of modifications made to Queensland law in response to the pandemic. With borders reopening and social restrictions gradually discontinued over 2021–22, police were able to fully resume their non-COVID related duties, including previously suspended police tasks such as roadside drink and drug driving tests.

While the COVID-19 pandemic remained an ongoing event, both globally and nationally in 2021–22, the social restrictions experienced earlier in the pandemic in Queensland have been lifted.

Readers are advised when considering the statistics in this report, that comparisons with figures in periods before the pandemic was declared must be made with caution.

## 1.2. Change to police recording of offences in Queensland

From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to record within QPRIME all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data.

Prior to July 2021, when an incident occurred which involved domestic and family violence, the police procedure was generally as follows:

- If there was an existing domestic violence protection order (DVO), a breach of that order was recorded for the offender but the associated offence (e.g. assault) may not have been recorded.
- If there was no DVO in place, the police created an incident record and may have issued a temporary protection order. If the victim declined to support prosecution, the offence may not have been recorded in QPRIME.

Analyses were conducted on selected recorded offences data and, while the analysis below indicates a significant increase in recorded *assault* offences in particular since the practice change was implemented, it is difficult to quantify how much of the observed increase in this and other DFV-related offences can be attributed to this change alone.

Other factors are also likely to have contributed to the observed increase, such as: increased public awareness of DFV, including through reports such as *Hear her voice*; improved mechanisms for reporting DFV; media coverage; cultural changes; population growth; natural variation; and the delivery of the *Queensland Government's DFV prevention strategy 2016–2026*.

Domestic and family violence is complex and DFV-related offences can take many forms and cover a broad range of offences. Recorded offences presented in this report, including those related to DFV, represent only those which have come to the attention of police.

**Readers are urged to be mindful of these factors when interpreting the statistics presented in this report.**

The following changes were observed in selected recorded offences data for Queensland, since the change in police practice was implemented on 1 July 2021.

**Please note:** The increases evident in recorded offences and victims statistics are not apparent to the same extent in offender statistics. Where a victim declines to support prosecution, the offence(s) recorded are withdrawn and police take no action against the alleged offender. In such cases, the offender is not included in offender statistics.

**Terms used frequently in this report** (see Glossary for more.)

**Offence:** Any act or omission by a person(s) for which a penalty could be imposed by the Australian legal system. Presented in this report in three categories:

**Offences against the person:** include homicide offences, assault, sexual offences, robbery and other offences against the person.

**Offences against property:** include unlawful entry, arson, other property damage, unlawful use of a motor vehicle, other theft, fraud, handling stolen goods.

**Other offences:** include drug offences, prostitution offences, liquor & gaming offences, breach DV order, trespassing and vagrancy, Weapons Act offences, good order offences, stock-related offences, traffic and related offences, miscellaneous.

**Offender:** in this report, a person aged 10 years or over who, through the clearance of an offence, is alleged to be responsible for committing that offence. A person may be recorded as an offender multiple times, if they were proceeded against by police for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period. Unless otherwise specified, offender data presented in this report do not represent a count of individual (unique) offenders.

**Child offender:** for the purpose of this report, is an alleged offender aged 10 to 17 years at the date police action commenced against them.

**Unique offender:** provides an estimate of the actual number of offenders and therefore is lower than the total number of offenders. Each person is counted once only in the reference period, regardless of how many times they have been proceeded against by police in the period.

**Victim:** Victim statistics in this report relate only to victims of offences against the person, reported to or detected by police within the reporting period. For most offences against the person, the victim is an individual person. Statistics on non-person victims have not been included in this report.

These data show one victim for each counted offence. However, a person may be counted multiple times if they were the victim of multiple offences belonging to different offence types within a single incident or recorded multiple times during the reference period. They would be counted once for each most serious offence per offence type. Unless otherwise specified, victim data presented in this report do not represent a count of individual (unique) victims.

**Unique victim:** provides an estimate of the actual number of recorded victims and therefore is lower than the total number of recorded victims. Each person is counted once only in the reference period, regardless of how many times they have been recorded as a victim of an offence.

Only offences with a status of *solved, unsolved, withdrawn* or *lapsed* are counted in this report.











### Crime locations




### 3.0 Recorded and cleared offences

In this section, statistics are presented for 2021–22 and the previous year, for recorded and cleared offences categorised as: offences against the person, against property, and other offences.

Recorded offences are those which have been reported to or detected by police within the reference period and recorded in QPRIME, and include those where no offender, or victim in some cases, has yet been identified. These are presented as both numbers and rates, and a percentage change indicator. Rates are calculated as reported offences per 100,000 persons, using the appropriate estimated resident population (ERP).

Cleared offences are presented as a count of offences *recorded and cleared in period* and *cleared in period, recorded previously*. The *percentage cleared* figures in Figure 1 refer only to those offences recorded and cleared in the same financial year. (See Glossary for definition of *cleared offences*.)

### 3.1. Recorded offences

**Please note:** From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to record all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data. (See section 1.2.)

The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and related containment measures were most apparent in 2020–21, particularly in property and other offences which both saw a decrease, while personal offences increased at that time.

The increase in recorded property offences observed in 2021–22 indicates a likely return to pre-pandemic levels for that offence category, with significant increases observed in *other theft (excl. unlawful entry)* (+15,097 offences, or +14.6%) and *unlawful entry* (+6,321 offences or +17.7%). However, some of the increase in property offences can be attributed to the increase in recorded DFV-related offences, which is driving the substantial increase in recorded offences against the person.


In contrast, other offences overall have continued to decline since the onset of the pandemic. In 2021–22, *drug offences* saw the greatest decrease, down by 15,103 or 19.6% compared with the previous year, followed by *good order offences* (–3,144 offences, or –7.0%). This was partially offset by a notable increase (+6,674 or +16.7%) in *breach of domestic violence order offences*.

## 4.0 Crime by region (SA4) – counts and rates


The tables in this section display the number of recorded offences and the offence rate per 100,000 estimated resident population (ERP), for 2012–13, 2020–21 and 2021–22, for Queensland and the state's 19 statistical areas level 4 (SA4s).

Population growth can lead to a rise in numbers of offences, and therefore simple counts cannot and should not be used to gauge the true level of crime in a region. However, it is important to note that transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP. This would have particular impact on high tourism areas where crime rates may be overestimated.

**Please note:** The tables in this section include some offences where the SA4 in which the offence occurred cannot be identified. This may occur for one of two reasons:

- (1) The offence was detected as part of a covert operation, and the location of the offence has not been recorded, to maintain security.
- (2) The accuracy of the address had not been verified at the time the data were extracted for inclusion in this publication. In such cases, the offences have been included in the Queensland total only. Therefore, SA4 statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.

**Please note the following with regard to this section:**

- Rates are presented per 100,000 estimated resident population.
- Although offence rate has been rounded to one decimal place, the actual rate was used to calculate the percentage rate change between the two periods.
- There was a significant decline in recorded offences overall in 2020–21, driven by a large decline in both property and other offences, due to the social restrictions in force during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The inflated one-year growth rates for some offences in 2021–22 partially reflect the removal of those social restrictions, and the impact of a change in police recording of offences implemented from 1 July 2021.

### 4.3. Offences against property

**Please note:** From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to record all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data. (See section 1.2.)

There was a significant decline in recorded offences against property in 2020–21, due to social restrictions in force during the COVID-19 pandemic. The inflated one-year growth rates for property offences in 2021–22 partially reflect the removal of those social restrictions.

## 4.4. Other offences

There was a significant decline in reported other offences overall in 2020–21, due to social restrictions in force during the COVID-19 pandemic, and this offence category has declined further in 2021–22.

However, Breach of Domestic Violence Order is a notable exception to this overall decline and increases were observed for this offence type in every statistical area level 4 in 2021–22. The most significant increases were observed in the SA4s of Cairns (+47.9%), Darling Downs–Maranoa (+46.6%) and Queensland–Outback (+39.6%).



## 5.0 Crime locations

This section provides a breakdown of recorded crime in 2021–22 by the type of location in which the offence occurred. The location classifications are based on those used by the ABS in *Recorded crime – Victims, Australia*.

A crime location is defined as the initial site where a criminal incident occurred, classified by the primary function of that site where the site has more than one function. This definition may encompass any surrounding land, yard or car parking area, together with any other structures existing at the location. (See Explanatory notes and glossary for further information.)

n.f.d. = not further disaggregated





## 6.0 Offenders

In this report, offender statistics do not represent a count of unique offenders, unless otherwise stated. Nor do they equate to the number of offences cleared. An individual may be recorded as an alleged offender multiple times, if they were proceeded against for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period.

The reference date used to generate statistics for the year under review is the date an action commenced against an alleged offender. As such, offenders proceeded against in the reference year, for matters reported in the same or in previous years, will be included in this report.

### In 2021–22:



### All offenders

- The total number of offenders remained relatively stable while unique offenders decreased slightly compared with 2020–21.
- Offenders identifying as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander increased notably (+11.1%) while unique Indigenous offenders decreased slightly (-0.6%).
- More than three-quarters of all offenders were male.
- *Drug offences* (18.4% of all offences), although on a decline, was still the most prevalent offence type among all offenders.

### Child offenders (aged 10–17 years at time of police action)

- Total child offenders increased by 13.7% while unique offender numbers remained relatively stable.
- Child offenders accounted for more than half of all offenders for *unlawful use of motor vehicle* (54.6%), *robbery* (53.7%) and *unlawful entry* (53.3%).
- *Other theft (excl. unlawful entry)* was the most prevalent offence among child offenders (11,799).

### Compared with 2012–13

- Offender numbers for *breach domestic violence order* more than doubled (+120.0%) over the period, the most significant increase of all offences.
- The number of male and female offenders increased by 25.6% and 5.5% respectively.
- The unique offender rate is lower in 2021–22, having declined from 2,809.1 to 2,234.6 per 100,000 persons aged 10 years and over.



## 6.1. Age and sex

Offender tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells ( $\leq 3$ ) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered. Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatory notes and glossary* for detail.)

Offender age is reported as at date police action was commenced against them, not at date offence occurred. Be aware that, in some instances, such as homicide and sexual offences, the time difference may be considerable.



### 6.1.1. Sex of offender

Police proceeded against 287,387 offenders in 2021–22 in relation to offences recorded during the same year or in the year(s) prior. While the number represents an increase of 25,848 offenders (+9.9%) over the 10-year time series, it was ranked the third lowest in the 10-year time series. Since 2014–15, the number of offenders proceeded against have stayed above 300,000 for the six consecutive years before dropping noticeably to 287,803 in 2020–21 and stayed around that level in 2021–22 (Figure 5).

While there were 1,965 fewer female offenders in 2021–22 (70,072) than in 2020–21 (72,037), there were 1,452 more male offenders (217,015 compared with 215,563). As a result, the male offender proportion increased slightly over the year, from 74.9% to 75.6% of all offenders in 2021–22.

(a) Totals include a small number of offenders whose sex was not stated.



### 6.1.2. Age distribution


**Figure 6 Offenders by age group**

Figure 6 shows the age distribution of offenders in 2021–22 compared with 2012–13. Offender numbers decreased for those aged 15–24 years, while increasing noticeably for 10–14-year-olds. For all age groups 25 years and older, offender numbers in each age group have increased to varying extent over the last decade, from 0.2% for 25–29-years to 63.0% for those aged 60 years or older.

The proportion of offenders in the 20–24 years and 25–29 years age groups both reached their lowest in 10 years, combining for only 27.1% of all offenders. Only just over half (52.4%) of all offenders were 29 years or younger in 2021–22 which is the second lowest proportion in the 10-year time series and likely a reflection of the ageing population.

## 6.2. Indigenous status

In 2021–22, police in Queensland proceeded against 80,654 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders, which exceeded the previous peak of 2019–20. It represents a significant increase of 11.1% from the 72,605 offenders recorded in the previous financial year (Figure 7). Over the 10-year time series, of all those offenders whose Indigenous status was stated, the proportion who identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander has increased noticeably, to 28.2% in 2021–22 compared with 22.7% in 2012–13. The proportion has fluctuated over the years although it has been on an upward trend since 2018–19.





### 6.2.2. Distribution by age, sex and Indigenous status

The distribution of offenders proceeded against by police in 2021–22 by age, sex and Indigenous status shows different patterns for the offender cohorts. For non-Indigenous male offenders, the most common age group was 15–19 years, closely followed by 25–29 years and 30–34 years. Whereas for non-Indigenous female offenders, there was little difference between the age groups of 15–19 years through to 35–39 years, with a small peak at 30–34 years (Figure 8).

**Figure 8 Non-Indigenous<sup>(a)</sup> offenders by age group and sex<sup>(b)</sup>, 2021–22**



By comparison, the proportion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders aged under 20 years was noticeably higher than that of non-Indigenous offenders in the same age category (42.4% and 37.5% respectively for Indigenous male and female offenders compared with 18.7% and 20.0% for non-Indigenous male and female offenders) (Figure 9).

Of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders in 2021–22, the age group most represented was 15–19 years for both males (16,608 or 28.1%) and females (5,015 or 23.2%). The number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders for the 15–19 years age group was nearly double that of the second-most common age group (i.e. 10–14 years) for males and over 1.5 times for females.

### 6.3. Offence category and type

In this report, offences are classified into three broad categories: offences against the person (comprising 9.4% of offenders proceeded against by police in 2021–22); offences against property (31.1%); and other offences (59.5%), and then further disaggregated by offence type (Table 58).

The most prevalent offences for which police proceeded against an offender in 2021–22 were *drug offences* (18.4%), *traffic and related offences* (13.6%) and *other theft (excl. unlawful entry)* (12.4%). *Good order offences* (12.3%) became the fourth-most prevalent after consistently being in the top 3 over the past decade.

*Other theft (excl. unlawful entry)* offences recorded the largest increase of offender numbers of any offence type in 2021–22 compared with the previous year (+5,219 or +17.2%). Also under offences against property, *unlawful entry* and *unlawful use of motor vehicle* had the second and third-greatest increases of offender numbers (respectively 3,332 or 24.3% and 2,304 or 23.7%). *Drug offences*, as in 2020–21, recorded the largest decrease over a year (–12,799 or –19.5%), reaching its lowest level since 2013–14.




**Figure 10 Offenders by age and offence category, 2021–22**

The distribution of offenders in each offence category varied according to the age of the offender. Compared with property and other offences, the proportion of offences against the person (ranging from 7.7% for offenders aged 24 years to 20.6% for those aged 10 years) was the smallest for most offender age groups, excluding those aged 10, 11, 58 and 59 years. However, while younger offenders were substantially more likely to be proceeded against in relation to property offences (66.8% of offenders aged 10–16-years), offenders from 17 years of age were substantially more likely to be proceeded against for 'other' offences (68.0% of offenders aged 20 years and over) (Figure 10).

Within the category of *other offences*, there is also an age pattern, although less pronounced (Figure 11). *Good order offences* accounted for 24.6% of child offenders (aged 10–17 years) compared with 17.7% of offenders aged 30 years and over. *Drug offences* became the predominant offence in this offence category for offenders at 14 years and peaked at 17 years of age, and accounted for almost a third (31.1%) of all offenders aged 14 years and over. The proportion that were *traffic and related offences* rose above 20% for offenders aged 19 years and remained steady until a further rise for those aged early fifties, peaking at 57 years (31.1%). The proportion of offenders proceeded against for *breach of domestic violence order* rose steadily with age and remained around 20% of *other offences* for offenders aged from late twenties to early fifties.

**Figure 11 Age distribution of offenders, other offences, 2021–22**



The age distribution of offenders for selected person and property offences also shows an age pattern (Figure 12). Although many offence types roughly follow the overall pattern of offending, offenders aged 10–19 years are substantially over-represented for *unlawful entry* and *unlawful use of motor vehicle* (i.e. well over 60% of offenders were within these age groups for these two offences), while *sexual offences* were more evenly distributed across age groups..

It should be noted, however, that the reference date for offender statistics is the date police commenced action against an offender, and some offences recorded in 2021–22 will have occurred in years prior.

## 6.4. Child offenders

### 6.4.1. Sex and Indigenous status


In 2021–22, police proceeded against 52,742 offenders aged 10–17 years in Queensland, representing an increase of 13.7% from 46,398 in 2020–21. The total number of child offenders was also the highest in the ten-year time series. The significant increase was mainly driven by increases in both male (+30.4%) and female (+21.0%) Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders compared with 2020–21, resulting in a time-series peak for both at 19,861 and 6,588 respectively.

Across the time series, the number of non-Indigenous male offenders aged 10–17 years has been trending downwards from 22,781 in 2012–13 to 19,232 in 2021–22 (–15.6%). Despite a slight increase in 2021–22 (to 19,232) after reaching the time-series low in the previous year, the number of non-Indigenous male offenders was exceeded by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander male offenders (19,861) for the first time in the 10-year time series.

Although the numbers have been converging in recent years, there were still slightly more non-Indigenous (6,771) than Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female offenders (6,588) aged 10–17 years in 2021–22 (Figure 13). Over the 10-year time series, the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female offenders has been trending upwards, increasing by 2,611 (+65.7%) from 3,977 in 2012–13.

In this report, child offenders are those aged 10 to 17 years at time police action commenced against them, for 2021–22 and across the time series.

### 6.4.2. Offence type

The six most prevalent offences have accounted for more than three-quarters of all child offending in 2021–22.

*Other theft (excl. unlawful entry)*, has consistently been the most prevalent of these, and made up almost a quarter of all offences by child offenders in 2021–22. *Unlawful use of motor vehicle* rose to be the third–most prevalent offence by child offenders this financial year, recording the largest increase in the proportion of all child offenders compared with 2012–13, up 5.7 percentage points from 6.7% to 12.4%. Conversely, *other property damage* showed the largest decrease in the proportion of all child offenders over the same period, down 5.7 percentage points from 13.4% to 7.6%. *Assault*, which replaced *good order offences*, has become one of the six most prevalent offences by child offenders for the first time in the 10-year period.


**Figure 14** Distribution of most prevalent offences by child offenders in 2021–22, compared with same offences in 2012–13



In number terms, in 2021–22 compared with 2012–13, child offenders for *unlawful use of motor vehicle* offences more than doubled, recording the largest increase of all offences (+3,411 offenders, to 6,566) (Figure 15).

Conversely, *other property damage* showed the largest decrease in child offenders over the same period (–2,268 offenders, to 4,026), followed by *good order offences* (–2,198 offenders, to 3,247)

**Figure 15** Change in child offending, selected offences<sup>(a)</sup>, 2012–13 to 2021–22





While child offenders accounted for nearly one-fifth (18.4%) of all offenders proceeded against by police in 2021–22, the highest proportion in the 10–year time series, this figure varied considerably across offence types.

In 2021–22, there were seven offence types where more than 30% were child offenders, and three where they comprised half or more of all offenders. *Unlawful use of motor vehicle* offences was the highest of these, with 54.6% of all offenders aged between 10 and 17 years, closely followed by *robbery* at 53.7% and *unlawful entry* at 53.3% (Figure 16).

Child offenders comprised over half of all offenders proceeded against for *unlawful use of motor vehicle*, *robbery*, and *unlawful entry* in 2021–22.


## 6.5. Unique offenders

There were 102,894 unique offenders in Queensland in 2021–22, a decrease of 1.8% from 104,772 unique offenders in the previous year (Figure 17). This was mainly due to a decrease in non-Indigenous offenders (–1,827 or –2.2%), although there was also a slight decrease in offenders identifying as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (–117 or –0.6%).

The number of unique offenders in 2021–22 was at its lowest in the 10-year time series, a decrease of 17.2% from the peak in 2015–16.

The steadily decreasing count in unique offenders has resulted in the overall unique offender rate continuing its steady downward trend from the time-series peak of 2,999.1 offenders per 100,000 persons aged 10 years or older in 2014–15, to the low of 2,234.6 offenders in 2021–22. The rates for both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders and non-Indigenous offenders were both at their lowest in the time series.


### 6.5.1. Age, sex and Indigenous status

The distribution of unique offenders in 2021–22 by age, sex and Indigenous status is displayed for both non-Indigenous and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander offenders in the two figures below.


**Figure 18 Non-Indigenous<sup>(a)</sup> unique offenders by age and sex<sup>(b)</sup>, 2021–22**

For both male and female non-Indigenous offenders, the most highly-represented age group was 20–24 years, as it has been in previous years, with numbers decreasing steadily through the older age groups, until 60 years and over (Figure 18).

Age of unique offender is reported as at date of *first* police action against them in the reference year.

In contrast, the 15–29 years age group was the most highly represented for both male and female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander unique offenders in 2021–22. This age group represented nearly half of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander unique offenders for both males and females (47.0% and 46.5% respectively) (Figure 19).



### 6.5.2. Age distribution


**Figure 20 Unique offenders by age group**

There were far fewer unique offenders in 2021–22 compared with 2012–13 (–9,205), with the largest decreases evident in the 15 to 24 years age groups. The age distribution of unique offenders has shifted towards older age groups over the same period (Figure 20). In 2021–22, unique offender numbers were lower in every age group from 10 to 34 years but higher in all age groups 35 years and over when comparing with the corresponding age groups in 2012–13.

There were 10,620 unique child offenders in 2021–22, a 20.5% decrease from 13,352 in 2012–13. The rate of unique child offenders also continued its steady decline to 1,926.4 per 100,000 persons aged 10–17 years, the lowest level recorded over the time series (Figure 21).

While the rate of unique adult offenders has continually been higher than that of unique child offenders throughout the time series, it too declined to its lowest level in 10 years, with 2,276.6 unique adult offenders per 100,000 persons aged 18 years and over in 2021–22. The total number of unique offenders aged 18 years and over proceeded against by police decreased 6.6%, from 98,747 in 2012–13 to 92,274 in 2021–22.

## 7.0 Victims of offences against the person

In this report, victim statistics relate to offences against the person only, and they relate only to offences reported to or detected by police. They do not represent a count of unique victims unless otherwise stated. Victim statistics are compiled on the basis of one victim per counted offence type within a single incident record by police.

Statistics are compiled on the basis of the date an offence was reported to/detected by police, regardless of when the offence occurred. In some instances, particularly with homicide and sexual offences, there may be a large time difference between when the offence occurred and the report/detection date.


### All offences against the person

- The personal victimisation rate rose sharply by almost 50%, largely driven by a more than two-fold increase in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander recorded victims.
- The victimisation rate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples is more than five times that for non-Indigenous people.
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males were three times more often victims of a *sexual offence* than non-Indigenous males.



### Assault accounted for 3 in 4 reported victims

- A quarter of all *assault* victims was aged 20–29 years.
- Recorded victims of *sexual offences* have increased by nearly 75% over the past two financial years.



### Female victims

- Six out of 10 reported victims of a personal offence were female.
- Three in five unique victims of a personal offence were females younger than 50 years old.
- Females were offended against almost four times as often as males by a partner/ex-partner.

## 7.1. Recorded victims

**Please note:** From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to now record all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data. (See section 1.2.)


Queensland Police Service recorded 64,540 victims of offences against the person in 2021–22, a 49.2% increase on the previous year (43,260 recorded victims in 2020–21) (Figure 22).

This has seen the total number of recorded victims more than double over the past ten years, from 28,012 in 2012–13, with the two most recent years accounting for a combined 79.6% of the total increase. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people accounted for 19.0% of recorded victims in 2021–22, despite representing only 4.6% of Queensland's total population<sup>2</sup>.

Due largely to reasons outlined in section 1.2, an unprecedented rise in Queensland's recorded victimisation rate occurred in 2021–22, with a 48.0% increase compared with the previous year, which itself had also seen a large increase (+20.6%). The overall victimisation rate in 2021–22 was 1,231.9 per 100,000 persons. Importantly, the rate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims more than doubled (+126.3%) to 5,205.3 per 100,000 persons in 2021–22 from 2,300.2 in 2020–21. Over the same period, the rate for non-Indigenous victims increased by 35.3% to 995.4 per 100,000 persons.

The number of victims where Indigenous status was not stated continued to rise, and increased substantially in 2021–22, by 2,452 or +76.7% compared with the previous financial year. A large proportion of victims whose Indigenous status was not stated were related to withdrawn offences.

7.1.1. Age and sex

Victim's age is as at date offence was reported to or detected by police, not at date offence occurred.

Be aware that, in some instances, particularly *homicide* and *sexual offences*, the time difference may be considerable.

Victim tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells ( $\leq 3$ ) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered.

Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatory notes* for more detail.)

### 7.1.2. Offence type

From July 2021, a change in police practice was implemented regarding the recording of domestic and family violence-related offences (See section 1.2 for details.). Therefore, the significant increase observed in personal offences in 2021–22 should be interpreted with caution.

Assault offences accounted for three in four (74.8% or 48,248) recorded victims of offences against the person in Queensland in 2021–22 (Table 60). Assault is the direct (and immediate/confrontational) infliction of force, injury or violence upon a person or persons, or the direct (and immediate/confrontational) threat of force, injury or violence where there is an apprehension that the threat could be enacted. Assault accounted for a considerably greater proportion of male victims than female victims (83.6% and 68.8% respectively).

Assault offences are further disaggregated on the basis of whether or not the assault involved injury, or other aggravating circumstances. In 2021–22, the two most prevalent types of assault experienced by recorded victims in Queensland were *serious assault* and *common assault* (42.2% and 42.9% respectively of total assault).

Assault offences accounted for a greater proportion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims than non-Indigenous victims (85.8% and 73.4% respectively), and the sex profile was notably different between these victim cohorts. There were 2.6 times more female than male Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people assaulted (7,552 and 2,944 respectively), while non-Indigenous females and males were almost equally victimised (17,161 and 17,027). *Grievous assault* and *serious assault* as a proportion of all assaults was higher among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female than male victims (70.4% and 50.4% respectively). This was not observed among non-Indigenous victims (47.8% and 46.4% for females and males respectively).

*Sexual offences* accounted for 12.1% of all recorded victims in 2021–22. Females comprised more than four in five (86.8% or 6,801) of all recorded victims of *sexual offences*, a proportion consistent across both the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous victim cohorts. Among *sexual offences*, *other sexual offences* accounted for the majority of recorded victims (63.7% compared with 36.3% for *rape and attempted rape*).

*Homicide* offences and *robbery* respectively accounted for 0.2% and 3.4% of all recorded victims in 2021–22, with males comprising a higher number of victims than females across both offence types.

The number of recorded *assault* victims more than doubled (+28,748 victims) in 2021–22 compared with 2012–13. This increase included +18,223 victims in 2021–22 compared with the previous year, the majority being victims of *common assault* (9,165) and *serious assault* (7,214) (Table 61). Similarly, recorded *sexual offences* victims increased 81.2% (+3,511) since the beginning of the series. Three-quarters (74.8%) of this increase in recorded *sexual offences* has occurred in the past two financial years (+2,625 victims since 2019–20).



Proportion-wise, *assault* has consistently accounted for around 70% of all victims of offences against the person over the 10-year time series. However, in 2021–22, assault victims accounted for 74.8% of all victims, an annual increase of 5.4 percentage points. This is largely driven by the increase in the proportion of *common assault* victims, which has increased from approximately one-quarter (26.6%) in 2020–21 to one-third (32.1%) of all assault victims in 2021–22.

*Sexual offences* accounted for 17.3% of reported victims at its highest point in the series in (2014–15), a proportion which has steadily reduced to 12.1% in 2021–22.

**Figure 23 Victims of assault and sexual offences**





### 7.1.3. Age and sex, for selected offences

The age and sex profiles of recorded victims can differ significantly depending on the offence type, as demonstrated in Figure 24 and Figure 25 below, for the selected offence types of *assault* and *sexual offences*. Victim age data presented in this report refer to the victim's age on the date the offence was reported/detected, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred.

In 2021–22, recorded victims of *assault* were more likely to be female (55.1%), while both genders show a similar age-distribution pattern. Females aged 20–29 years represented the largest single cohort of all female recorded assault victims in 2021–22 (7,186 victims, or 27.1%) (Figure 24). The largest cohort of all male assault victims in the same period was also in this age group (4,961 reported victims, or 23.0%). Numbers of both male and female assault victims steadily declined with each successive age group after 20–29 years. Notably, victims aged 50 years or older were 1.2 times more likely to be male than female, and 1.3 times if aged nine or younger.

1 in 4 recorded *assault* victims were aged 20–29 years


Females aged 10–29 years comprised almost three out of five recorded victims of *sexual offences*

Compared with recorded assault victims, the age and sex profile of recorded victims of *sexual offences* was disproportionate, with females outnumbering male victims in every age category, at a ratio ranging from 2.4 times (0–9 years) to 11.3 times (20–29 years) (Figure 25).

The total number of female sexual assault victims was 6,795 which is equivalent to 87.0% of all victims of sexual offences whose age and sex were known.

Although the most prevalent age group for both male and female recorded victims of sexual offences was 10–19 years, the number of female victims in this age cohort (3,262) is nine times that of males, resulting in the single largest group of recorded victims of this offence type in 2021–22 (41.8% of all whose age and sex were known).

### 7.1.4. Recorded victimisation rate

**Age-standardisation** is a technique used to enhance the comparability of event rates from different populations or sub-populations over time by making adjustments for the confounding effects of differences in age structure between the populations being compared.

Age-standardised victimisation rates in 2021–22 varied markedly according to the Indigenous status and sex of the victim, as well as offence type. Figure 26 demonstrates this variability for *sexual offences* and the subcategories of *assault offences*.

Across each of the offences shown, both male and female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people recorded higher victimisation rates than non-Indigenous people.


The victimisation rates for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons were consistently higher for females than males across all offences shown, except for *grievous assault*.

Non-Indigenous female and male victims experienced fairly similar victimisation rates, except for *sexual offences*. In contrast, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims had much more distinct gender profiles, except for *grievous assault*.

Across the offences shown, female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims of *serious assault* recorded the highest victimisation rates in 2021–22 closely followed by *common assault*, at a rate of 2,854 and 2,850 victims per 100,000 persons respectively. Those rates were equivalent to a rate ratio of approximately nine and eight times the rates respectively for non-Indigenous females. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males were almost four times as likely as non-Indigenous males to become victims to those two offences, and were over three times more often victims of a sexual offence. *Sexual offences* marked the only offence type where the rate ratio between non-Indigenous and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims was larger for males than for females.

While the largest rate ratio in 2021–22 was observed for female victims of *grievous assault*, where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander females were 14 times as likely as non-Indigenous females to be victimised, the numbers for both were the lowest of all selected offences (at a rate of 104 victims per 100,000 persons compared with seven for non-Indigenous females).

### 7.1.5. Relationship of offender to victim

**Please note:** This table counts the number of (non-unique) victims, rather than offenders or relationships. Victims of all offences against the person are included, regardless of the cleared/solved status of the offence. Relationship is recorded at time offence was reported, and relationship classifications used are derived from those used by the ABS in *Recorded crime – Victims, Australia*.

Across all offences against the person in 2021–22 where the offender–victim relationship was recorded, 65.3% of recorded victims in Queensland knew their offender and almost half occurred in a domestic or family setting (45.9%).<sup>3</sup> The nature of the relationship between the offender and the victim varied markedly according to the sex and Indigenous status of the victim, as well as the offence type. Figure 27 demonstrates this divergence for the selected offence types of *assault* and *sexual offences*.


**Domestic and family violence accounted for 7 in 10 Indigenous and over 5 in 10 non-Indigenous female *assault* victims.**

Almost one-half of all recorded *assault* victims (48.2%) was in a domestic or family relationship with their offender, and four in five (82.2%) Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female victims of *assault* knew their offender. By comparison, non-Indigenous females were notably less likely than Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female *assault* victims to have known their offender (71.5%) and much less likely to have been in an intimate relationship with them (55.1%).

Non-Indigenous male *assault* victims were more likely than all other *assault* victims to have been offended against by a person(s) unknown to them (38.7%), and the least likely to be in a family or domestic relationship with their offender (26.3%). Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males were as likely as non-Indigenous females to become *assault* victims to an intimate offender (55.3%).

Across all recorded victims of *sexual offences*, around two in three victims knew their offender. Among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims, females were more likely than males to be in a family or domestic relationship with their offender (42.8% vs 35.6%), a trend also observed for non-Indigenous victims (38.8% for females vs 28.7% for males). Although *sexual offences* were over four times more likely to be committed by a person known to the victim (71.6% vs 16.4%), non-Indigenous males were twice as likely to be offended against by an unknown person than Indigenous males (15.4% vs 7.6%).

### 7.1.6. Recorded victimisation rate of DFV-related offences by Indigenous status

**Please note:** From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to now record all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data. (See section 1.2.)

Domestic and family violence-related victimisations presented in this report relate only to offences against the person and do not take into account DFV-related property or other offences that may occur. They represent those offences against the person where victims indicated to police they were in a domestic or family relationship with the offender.

Data describing the relationship of offender to victim are used as one of the sources for identifying DFV-related offences (Table 62). However, a proportion of victims of offences against the person (6.3% in 2021–22) have no information recorded about the relationship between the offender and victim. Because of this, and the counting rules used to record *assault* incidents, DFV-related offences against the person data in this report may under-represent the number of these offences in Queensland.

Across all recorded offences against the person in 2021–22 where offender–victim relationship was recorded and victim's sex was known, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims were considerably more likely than non-Indigenous victims to be offended against by someone with whom they were in a family or domestic relationship (64.6% compared with 40.4%). Further, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims were also more likely than non-Indigenous victims to be offended against by a partner or ex-partner in 2021–22 (40.8% compared with 24.3%).

However, examination of specific victimisation rates for DFV-related personal offences by Indigenous status, age and sex reveal substantial variation in experiences within the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous recorded victim cohorts. It must be remembered that, in this report, a victim's age is based on the date the offence was reported to or detected by police, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred, and some offences will have occurred in years prior to 2021–22.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander females aged 30–39 years were the cohort most likely to be offended against by someone in their family or domestic relationship.

In 2021–22, recorded Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander female victimisation rates for DFV-related person offences increased with age, peaking at 10,216 victims per 100,000 persons for females aged 30–39 years, before declining steeply with each successive age group (Figure 28).

In contrast, victimisation rates for non-Indigenous females remained within a much smaller range, peaking at 20–29 years of age (1,047 per 100,000 persons) and then declining steadily with each successive age group.


Young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander females aged 10 to 17 years experienced victimisation rates almost five times that of non-Indigenous females in the same age group for DFV-related offences. This differential in rates continued to increase in adulthood, ranging from just under eight to almost 12 times for 18–19-year-olds and those aged 60 years and older respectively, when compared with non-Indigenous female victims.

Recorded victimisation rates for DFV-related offences among non-Indigenous males peaked at 18–19 years of age, at 320 victims per 100,000 persons, before slightly declining and remaining around 260 victims per 100,000 persons for the next three 10-year age groups. For every age group, non-Indigenous males were less likely than non-Indigenous females to be a victim of a DFV-related offence.

The victimisation rate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males was highest at 30–39 years of age (at 2,701 victims per 100,000 persons) closely followed by those aged 40–49 years (2,666 per 100,000 persons). Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males aged between 30 and 59 years were at least 10 times more likely to be victimised by a family member or domestic partner than non-Indigenous males in the same age bracket.

Overall, among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims, females experienced the highest DFV-related victimisation rates in all age groups, while males experienced the second-highest, which were higher than that of non-Indigenous females for every age group.

## 7.2. Unique victims

In 2021–22, Queensland Police Service recorded a total of 52,202 unique victims of offences against the person, a 41.2% increase on the previous year (+15,240 unique victims) (Figure 29).

Since the time-series low in 2014–15, the number of unique victims has been increasing steadily, albeit slowly until two consecutive sharp rises in 2020–21 and 2021–22, accounting for 72.1% of the total increase over seven years (+21,676 unique victims).

Similarly, the unique victimisation rate has been rising steadily since 2014–15 and plateaued in the three years prior to its first incline in 2020–21, followed by another rise in the current reporting period. The time-series high of 996.4 victims per 100,000 persons in 2021–22 was 40.1% higher than in 2020–21 and 113.9% higher than the low in 2014–15.


Both the count and rate of unique victims of personal offences reached a 10-year high in 2021–22.

### 7.2.1. Indigenous status

Notably, the number of unique Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander victims increased by 86.6% since 2020–21. This was almost three times the proportional increase observed for non-Indigenous unique victims over the same period (30.8%) (Figure 29).

In 2021–22, more than one in six unique victims identified as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (where Indigenous status was stated). This is disproportionate to Queensland's overall population where approximately one in every 22 residents identified as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (4.6% at August 2021).<sup>4</sup>


### 7.2.2. Age and sex

In 2021–22, unique victims aged 0 to 49 years were more likely to be female than male (86.4% compared with 79.9%), while across older age groups (aged 50 years and over) unique victims were more likely to be male than female (20.1% compared with 13.6%) (Figure 30). Over the 10-year time series, unique victim rates have grown faster among females than males, and by 2021–22 outnumbered the latter in all but the previously mentioned age groups 50 years and older. In 2012–13, only victims aged 10–19 years were more likely to be female than male (Figure 31). The first year that unique female victims outnumbered males in all age groups from 0 to 29 years was 2015–16, with the 30–39 years age group added in the following year.


Females aged 20–29 years represented the largest group of unique victims in 2021–22 (7,491 or 14.4% of all victims with both age and sex identified), closely followed by females aged 10–19 years (6,574 or 12.6%) and those aged 30–39 years (6,166 or 11.8%). This is indicative of the large number of victims of *sexual offences* and *assault* for these two cohorts. Children aged 0–9 years have comprised the smallest unique victim cohort overall since 2018–19, while prior to that, the smallest victim cohort had been persons aged 60 years and over.

### Glossary

**Age standardisation:** a statistical method used to enhance the comparability of event rates from different population or sub-population groups over time by making adjustments for the confounding effects of differences in age structure between the populations being compared—e.g. the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous populations.

**Cleared offences:** An offence is deemed to be cleared under, but not restricted to, one of the following circumstances:

- Police action\* has been taken against an offender.
- The offender has died or been admitted to a psychiatric facility before police have proceeded with a charge.
- The offender has diplomatic immunity.
- The offender is serving a sentence and no useful purpose would be served by prosecution.
- The offender is a child and no further action will be taken in accordance with *Youth Justice Act 1992*.
- There is a bar to prosecution (e.g. defences and exculpations under the *Criminal Code Act 1899*, or other Queensland statutes).
- The offender is being dealt with by another agency apart from QPS (e.g. RSPCA or other Queensland Government department).
- There is sufficient evidence to determine that the offender committed the offence but will not be charged as it is not in the public interest.
- There is sufficient evidence to determine the offender committed the offence but none of the offences can be sufficiently particularised to commence a prosecution.
- The victim is too young to proceed without sufficient corroboration to support their testimony.
- There is sufficient evidence to determine that the offender committed the offence but will not be charged as the offence was committed against a child who has been interviewed but did not sufficiently disclose the abuse and without other evidence the case cannot proceed.

- The victim or essential witness has died prior to the offender being charged.
- The victim formally withdraws the complaint and no longer wishes to continue with the complaint.

Note that the recovery of stolen or otherwise unlawfully obtained property does not in itself clear or solve an offence.

**\*Police action type:** Police may proceed against an offender in any of the following ways:

**Arrest:** The taking into custody of an offender to compel that person's appearance before a court.

**Summons:** A direction or command issued by a magistrate or justice of the peace to an offender to appear before a court with reference to a matter described therein, at a given time and place.

**Notice to appear:** A notice issued and personally served by a police officer upon an offender whom he/she reasonably suspects has committed / is committing an offence, to appear before a court, with reference to a matter described therein, at a stated time and place.

**Warrant:** An authority under the hand of a judge or justice of the peace to arrest an offender in order that the person may be dealt with according to the law.

**Caution:** An official caution administered to a child under the provisions of the Youth Justice Act and includes the cautioning of persons over 65 years of age and intellectually disabled persons for minor criminal offences in accordance with official QPS policy. The term does not apply to any informal process where a child is spoken to by an officer where the officer is exercising discretion in relation to the child's particular behaviour or actions.

**Community conference:** The referral of a child under the provisions of the Youth Justice Act to community conference by a police officer before the start of a proceeding for an offence, or by court after a finding of guilty is made against a child for the offence.

**Other:** The offender is known and sufficient evidence has been obtained but there is a bar to prosecution or other official process.

**Confidentialisation:** a change made to small-value cells ( $\leq 3$ ) in aggregated person-related data (see Notes).

**Crime location:** Refers to the initial site where a criminal incident occurred, determined based on primary use or function. Surrounding land, yard or parking area connected to a building or other structure are assigned to the same category of use. If a location serves more than one function, they are classified per the primary function.

**Administration or Professional** includes business, government.

**Dwelling** includes boarding house, motel, unit, other dwelling.

**Educational** includes school, university, TAFE, library.

**Health** includes hospital, hospital grounds, medical.

**Justice** includes court, police station, correctional centre.

**Open space** includes beach, boat ramp, bushland, crown land, river, waterway.

**Other n.e.c.** includes construction site, mail, military area, rest area.



**Recreational** includes adult entertainment, brothel, caravan park, cinema, night club, gaming.

**Retail** includes chemist, food shop, garage, hotel, licensed premises, restaurant, Post Office, shopping centre.

**Transport** includes airport, carpark, railway, terminal, wharf, train, in transit.

**Offence:** Any act or omission by a person or persons for which a penalty could be imposed by the Australian legal system.

Offences are presented under three broad categories: offences against the person, against property, and other offences. They are further disaggregated and grouped by offence type.

**Offender:** A person aged 10 years or over who, through the clearance of an offence, is alleged to be responsible for committing that offence.

**Child offender:** in this report, an alleged offender aged 10 to 17 years on the date police action commenced against them.

**Population subgroup:** In this report, this term is used where rates are calculated for each age group by Indigenous status and/or sex. It refers to the portion of the population to which a statistic pertains, e.g. non-Indigenous females aged 10–17 years.

**Victim:** For most offences against the person, 'the victim' is an individual person. In some cases, such as robbery and extortion, the victim may be an individual person or an organisation. Only person victims have been included in this report.

## Notes

The information displayed in this report may vary from data published elsewhere by QGSO and others, due to differences in the dates data were extracted and frequency of revision, or in counting rules or statistical standards applied. Readers are urged to exercise caution when making comparison between publications.

Data in this report have not been tested to determine whether changes over time are statistically significant.

**Source – QPRIME:** All crime statistics presented in this report are derived from unpublished data recorded in official crime reports in QPRIME, supplied by QPS and collated by QGSO.

### Age:

**Victim age** data presented in this report refer to the victim's age on the date the offence was reported/detected, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred. Particular care should be exercised when interpreting age data for sexual assault victims.

**Offender age** data presented in this report refer to the offender's age on the date the offence was cleared/actioned by police, rather than their age on the date the offence occurred or the offence was reported/detected.

### Confidentialisation:

Confidentialising data involves removing or altering information or collapsing detail (through application of statistical disclosure controls) to mitigate the risk that a person may be identified in the data (either directly or indirectly).

Victim and alleged offender tables contain person-based variables and include demographic information. Therefore, such tables in this report are subject to confidentialisation to ensure the anonymity of individuals is protected where numbers are small and there is a reasonable likelihood that a person may be identified from the data published. This process is applied to aggregated data only prior to release.

QGSO has confidentialised cells in offender and victim-related tables with values ranging from 1 to 3. This is denoted in the tables by the number '≤ 3' appearing in cells with small values. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered.

For the purpose of calculating row and column totals, each cell with a value of 1 to 3 is assigned a value of 2, regardless of the true value of that cell. This methodology allows for totals to be calculated in tables with small value cells, but this does mean that totals for certain variables may not be the same across tables within the report.

**Counting methodology:** This report uses counting rules originally developed by the ABS and used by Queensland Police for the publication of crime statistics relating to recorded offences against the person, victims and offenders. The following counting rules have been applied in this publication.

**Offences:** For offences against the person, for each victim within a distinct criminal incident (occurrence), the most serious offence (MSO) per offence type is counted. A single criminal incident may therefore result in several offences being recorded.

Sexual offences, which includes 'Rape and attempted rape' and 'Other sexual offences', is the **exception to the national counting rule**. The counting rule applied in respect of this group of offences is that, for each victim, the MSO per offence type is counted on the basis of time and place.

For offences against property and other offences, no national counting rules exist and, for such offences, each distinct criminal act per criminal incident is counted.

**Offenders:** Count of one for each unique recorded offence type cleared or solved through police action against an individual offender within a single incident, for a specified geographic area and period. An individual offender is counted multiple times during the reference period, if they were proceeded against for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period.

**Unique offenders:** An individual offender is counted only once during the reference period, irrespective of the number of offences committed within the same incident or the number of times they were dealt with by police.

**Victims:** For each recorded victim within a distinct criminal incident, the MSO per offence type is counted. Where the same individual is subjected to multiple offences belonging to different offence types within a single incident, then, in accordance with the MSO counting rule, that victim is counted multiple times (once for each MSO per offence type). Only victims of offences against the person are presented in this report.

**Unique victims:** An individual victim is counted once only in the reference period, regardless of how many times they have been recorded as a victim of an offence (against the person).

### Geography:

In the **main report**, all data are presented at state (Queensland) level. Number and rate of offences are also presented in tables for Queensland's 19 statistical areas level 4 (SA4) under the ASGS.

These tables include some offences where the SA4 in which the offence occurred cannot be identified. This may occur for one of two reasons:

The offence was detected as part of a covert operation, and the location of the offence has not been recorded, to maintain security; or the accuracy of the address has not been determined at the time that the data were extracted for



inclusion in this publication. That is, the address was not verified.

In these cases, the offences have been included in the Queensland total only. Therefore, SA4 statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.

In the **Appendix**, all data are presented by Queensland Police Service administrative regions (seven police regions and 15 police districts).

In cases where the police region in which the offence occurred cannot be identified (for reasons outlined above), the offences have been included in the Queensland total only. Therefore, police region statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.

**Indigenous status:** based on self-identification by the individual who comes into contact with police as one of the following four standard options:

Neither Aboriginal nor Torres Strait Islander (non-Indigenous); Aboriginal; Torres Strait Islander; Both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander.

In this publication, the term 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander' is used to refer to any person who identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.

Indigenous status of victim/offender has not been identified in a relatively small number of offences, and these are quantified in the table footnotes where applicable.

**Offence classification:** Offence codes and groupings presented in this publication are those used by QPS and are based on the Australian National Classification of Offences (ANCO, 1985).

**Interpreting rates:** Rates are calculated per 100,000 persons, using the appropriate estimated resident population (ERP) of the specified region, published by the ABS, as at 30 June.

**Offence rate** is calculated as:

$$\frac{\text{number of offences}}{\text{ERP}} * 100,000$$

using the mid-point ERP for the reference year (e.g. average of ERP as at 30 June 2020 plus ERP as at 30 June 2021 for the 2020–21 reference year).

**Unique offender rate:** Expressed as the number of unique offenders per 100,000 of the estimated resident population (ERP) aged 10 years and over.

**Unique victim rate:** Expressed as the number of unique victims per 100,000 of the total estimated resident population (ERP).

Rates enable comparison of crime to be made over time and between geographical areas, since the size of the population is taken into account in the calculation. However, comparisons of crime rates should be interpreted with caution due to the many factors which differ from region to region, including: the composition of its population (age, sex, ethnicity and employment); climate and geographical features; the economic structure (including local industry and the level and distribution of income).

It should be noted also that transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP. This would have particular impact on high tourism areas where crime rates may be overestimated.

**Reference date:** The reference date for recorded offences and victims is the date an offence is reported to or detected by police. For cleared offences, the reference date is the date the

offence was cleared by police. For offender statistics, the reference date is the date an action is commenced.

**Reference year:** Years quoted in this report are financial year (i.e. from 1 July to 30 June). Statistics produced on the basis of date recorded may be affected over time by lags in completing and/or processing some crime reports. Where offences recorded in the reference year are not processed for inclusion until the following year, revised data will be presented in subsequent publications. As such, time series data published in this publication may vary from data published previously by Queensland Police Service.

Time series data are presented for ten financial years, from 1 July 2012 to 30 June 2022.

#### Variables not stated

In 2021–22 there were:

- 5,650 recorded victims for whom Indigenous status was not stated, 118 recorded victims for whom sex was not stated, and 31 recorded victims for whom age was not stated (note, some records had more than one variable not stated)
- 5,263 unique victims for whom Indigenous status was not stated, 106 unique victims for whom sex was not stated, and 31 unique victims for whom age was not stated (note, some records had more than one variable not stated).
- 916 recorded offenders whose Indigenous status was not stated and 300 recorded offenders whose sex was not stated (note, some records had more than one variable not stated)
- 752 unique offenders whose Indigenous status was not stated and 161 unique offenders whose sex was not stated (note, some records had more than one variable not stated).

All data comparisons presented by Indigenous status exclude records where Indigenous status was not stated.



# 1.0 Introduction

The *Appendix: Crime report, Queensland Police Service administrative regions, 2021–22* comprises a series of tables and graphs, and supplements the *Crime report, Queensland 2021–22*. Statistics relating to recorded and cleared offences, victims of offences against the person and offenders in all offence categories are featured and are presented by police administrative regions (Figure A1).

Statistics in this supplementary report are also presented as both counts and rates. Using counts to gauge the level of crime is problematic, as areas with larger populations will presumably have higher numbers of offences than areas with smaller populations. Calculation of rates per 100,000 population allows direct comparisons of recorded crime to be made across different geographical areas and across time, since the size of the population is taken into account in the calculation.

Data which form the basis of this report are derived from official crime reports recorded in Queensland Police Records and Information Management Exchange (QPRIME). Only offences with a status of solved, withdrawn, lapsed or unsolved are counted in this report. Cancelled, not substantiated, and unfounded crime reports have been excluded.

The information presented in this report may vary from data published elsewhere by QGSO and others, due to differences in the dates data were extracted and frequency of revision, or in counting rules or statistical standards applied. Readers are therefore urged to exercise caution when making comparison between publications.

The statistics presented in this report should also be read in conjunction with the Explanatory notes and glossary in the main report, where counting methodologies and other supporting information are provided to aid in the interpretation of rates and numbers presented.

## 1.1. Change to police recording of offences in Queensland

From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to record within QPRIME all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data.

Prior to July 2021, when an incident occurred which involved domestic and family violence, the police procedure was generally as follows:

- If there was an existing domestic violence protection order (DVO), a breach of that order was recorded for the offender but the associated offence (e.g. assault) may not have been recorded.
- If there was no DVO in place, the police created an incident record and may have issued a temporary protection order. If the victim declined to support prosecution, the offence may not have been recorded in QPRIME.

Analyses were conducted on selected recorded offences data and, while the analysis, below, indicates a significant increase in recorded *assault* offences in particular since the practice change was implemented, it is difficult to quantify how much of the observed increase in this and other DFV-related offences can be attributed to this change alone.

Other factors are also likely to have contributed to the observed increase, such as: increased public awareness of DFV, including through reports such as *Hear her voice*; improved mechanisms for reporting DFV; media coverage; cultural changes; population growth; natural variation; and the delivery of the *Queensland Government's DFV prevention strategy 2016–2026*.

Domestic and family violence is complex and DFV-related offences can take many forms and cover a broad range of offences. Recorded offences presented in this report, including those related to DFV, represent only those which have come to the attention of police.

**Readers are urged to be mindful of these factors when interpreting the statistics presented in this report.**

The following changes were observed in selected recorded offences data for Queensland, since the change in police practice was implemented on 1 July 2021 (Table A1).

## 2.0 Recorded and cleared offences by police region and district



**Please note:** The tables in this section include some offences where the police district in which the offence occurred cannot be identified. This may occur for one of two reasons:

- (1) The offence was detected as part of a covert operation, and the location of the offence has not been recorded, to maintain security.
- (2) The accuracy of the address had not been verified at the time the data were extracted for inclusion in this publication.

In such cases, the offences have been included in the available geographical level only. Therefore, police region statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.



## 3.0 Regional comparisons

The graphs in this section display changes in the rates of selected recorded offences per 100,000 estimated resident population (ERP), from 2020–21 to 2021–22, for Queensland and the seven Queensland Police Service regions: Brisbane, Central, Far Northern, North Coast, Northern, South Eastern and Southern.

Expressing offences in terms of rate per 100,000 persons enables the recorded crime level of a region to be compared with itself over time and with that of other regions.

Population growth can lead to a rise in numbers of offences, and therefore simple counts cannot and should not be used to gauge the true level of crime in a region. However, it is important to note that transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP. This would have particular impact on high tourism areas where crime rates may be overestimated.

### Please note the following with regard to this section:

- Rates are presented per 100,000 estimated resident population.
- Although offence rate has been rounded to one decimal place, the actual rate was used to calculate the absolute rate change between the two periods.
- Any of the tables in this section may include some offences where the region in which the offence occurred cannot be identified. Such offences have been included in the Queensland totals only, and therefore region statistics may not always sum to Queensland totals.

**Also note:** From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to now record all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data (See section 1.2.).


This has resulted in a significant increase in reported offences against the person, most notably *assault, other property damage* and some *sexual offences*.

Offence data by region are expressed as rate per 100,000 estimated resident population. Transient population groups such as tourists are not factored into the ERP.

When comparing rates, please be aware that scales used vary between figures.



**Figure A2** Offences against the person – all offences, by police region






**Figure A4 Other homicide offences<sup>(a)(b)</sup>, by police region**



**Figure A5 Assault – all, by police region**






**Figure A7 Serious assault<sup>(a)</sup>, by police region**


**Figure A8 Serious assault (other)<sup>(a)</sup>, by police region**



**Figure A9 Common assault, by police region**





**Figure A10 Sexual offences – all, by police region**






**Figure A12 Other sexual offences<sup>(a)</sup>, by police region**






**Figure A13 Robbery – all, by police region**




**Figure A14 Armed robbery, by police region**


**Figure A16 Other offences against the person – all<sup>(a)</sup>, by police region**






**Figure A17 Kidnapping, abduction etc., by police region**



**Figure A18 Extortion, by police region**




**Figure A19 Stalking, by police region**

**Figure A20 Life endangering acts<sup>(a)</sup>, by police region**





**Figure A21 Offences against property – all offences, by police region**




**Figure A22 Unlawful entry – all, by police region**




**Figure A23 Unlawful entry with intent – dwelling, by police region**




**Figure A24 Unlawful entry with intent – shop, by police region**




**Figure A25 Unlawful entry with intent – other, by police region**


**Figure A27 Other property damage<sup>(a)</sup>, by police region**






**Figure A28 Unlawful use of motor vehicle, by police region**




**Figure A29 Other theft (excl. unlawful entry), by police region**







Figure A33 Drug offences, by police region




**Figure A34 Liquor offences (excl. drunkenness), by police region**




**Figure A35 Breach of domestic violence order, by police region**




**Figure A36 Trespassing and vagrancy, by police region**



**Figure A37 Weapons Act offences, by police region**




**Figure A38 Good order offences<sup>(a)</sup>, by police region**

## 4.0 Offenders by age and sex, by police region

This section presents statistics about offenders proceeded against by police, by Queensland Police Region.

An offender is any person aged 10 years or over who, through the clearance of an offence, is deemed to be responsible for committing that offence.

In this report, offender statistics refer to the number of offences cleared or solved through an action against an offender. They do not represent a count of unique offenders, nor do they equate to the number of offences cleared. An individual may be recorded as an offender multiple times, if they were proceeded against for multiple offence types within the same incident or multiple times within the reference period.

The reference date used to generate statistics for the year under review is the date an action commenced against an offender, regardless of when the offence occurred. As such, offenders proceeded against in the reference year, for matters recorded in the same or in previous years, will be included in this report.

Figures in the following tables do not represent a count of unique offenders, as an individual may be recorded as an offender once or multiple times in the reporting period.

Offender's age is reported as at date police action was commenced against them, not at date offence occurred. Be aware that, in some instances, the time difference may be considerable.

To protect the anonymity of individuals, offender tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells ( $\leq 3$ ) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered. Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatory notes* for more detail.)

## 5.0 Victims of offences against the person, by police region

This section presents statistics about victims of offences against the person, by Queensland Police Region.

In this report, victim statistics relate only to victims of offences against the person, reported to or detected by police within the reporting period. For most offences against the person 'the victim' is an individual person. Offences where the victim was an organisation have not been included in this report.

The statistics are compiled on the basis of one victim per counted offence type within a single incident, and do not represent a count of unique victims. A person may be counted multiple times if they were the victim of multiple offences being to different offence types within a single incident or recorded multiple times during the reference period. They would be counted once for each most serious offence per offence type.

The reference date for the year under review is the date an offence was reported to/detected by police, regardless of when the offence occurred. In some instances, particularly with homicide and sexual offences, there may be a large time difference between when the offence occurred and the report/detection date.

**Please note:** From 1 July 2021, a change in recording practices was implemented by the Queensland Police Service, requiring police officers to now record all criminal offences associated with domestic and family violence (DFV) incidents that come to their attention. Consequently, 2021–22 presents as a break in the time series for DFV-related variables that are based on recorded offences data. (See section 1.2.)

Victim's age is reported as at date offence was reported to / detected by police, not at date offence occurred. Be aware that, in some instances, the time difference may be considerable.

Figures in the following tables do not represent a count of unique victims, as an individual may be recorded as a victim once or multiple times in the reporting period.

To protect the anonymity of individuals, victim tables have been subjected to confidentialisation where cell values range from 1 to 3. All such cells ( $\leq 3$ ) are assigned a nominal value of 2. Cells with a value of zero remain unaltered. Totals for certain variables, therefore, may vary slightly across tables within the report. (See *Explanatory notes* for more detail.)



## 5.2. Relationship of offender to victim

**Please note:** There has been a change in police practice with police now required to report all criminal offences associated with a DFV investigation. A substantial proportion of these are withdrawn due to victims electing not to proceed. This has led to an increase in reported and cleared offences and only a slight increase in police actions against offenders. The tables in this section count the number of (non-unique) victims, rather than offenders or relationships. Victims of all offences against the person are included, regardless of the cleared/solved status of the offence. Relationship is recorded at time offence was reported, and relationship classifications used are derived from those used by the ABS in *Recorded crime – Victims, Australia*.




